BIG WINNERS!

• VIRGINIA STATE • HOWARD • TEXAS SOUTHERN
 • MOREHOUSE • LIVINGSTONE WOMEN

• Head coach **Lonnie Blow's** Trojans of **Virginia State** (16-5, 10-2 CIAA, 6-0 N. Div.) moved to the top of the BCSP Div. II ranking and the top of the **CIAA** North Division race with a 3-0 week, getting wins over its two nearest division challengers – **Lincoln**, 63-59 in OT Saturday and **Bowie State**, 62-61 last Wednesday – and a win this Wednesday over **Saint Augustine's**, 71-63. VSU has now won eight straight games.

Tyler Peterson canned the second of two free throws with :05 seconds left to give the Trojans the win over Bowie State. Peterson was fouled by **Zafir Williams** seconds after BSU's **Cameron Knox** knocked down a 3-pointer with :19 seconds left to tie the score at 61. Williams got off a jumper in the final seconds that was no good.

BSU trailed 34-25 at the half and was behind 60-52 with 3:51 left before Knox scored eight of nine Bulldog points to knot score at 61. Knox finished with 18 to lead BSU. **Elijah Moore** had 17 to lead VSU.

Lincoln was down 35-22 to VSU at the break but fought back to tie and temporarily take the lead in the final two minutes before settling for a 60-60 tie at the end of regulation. In overtime, VSU hit on 11 of 12 free throws while Lincoln made just one of two. **Tyrece Little** led four Trojans in double-figures with 18 points. **Joshua Davis** and **Tony Efese** had 14 to top Lincoln.

Little again led the Trojans with 18 points as they got a 71-53 inter-conference win over St. Augustine's.

• **Howard** (12-10, 6-2 MEAC) notched wins over **Morgan State** (64-48) and **Maryland-Eastern Shore** (83-74) to move into sole possession of third place in the **MEAC**. The 12 wins for the Bison, under fifth-year head coach **Kevin Nickelberry**, are the most since 2004 and the six conference wins and third-place positioning headed into the final month of the season is their best in over a decade.

Six-eight senior forward **James Carlton**, a College of Charleston transfer, has been the difference and catalyst for the Bison who have won five of their last six games. He had some impressive plays while scoring a career-high 32 points, half of the Bison's total, in Saturday's win over Morgan State. He added 31 points and 11 rebounds in the UMES win. Carlton, who is averaging 15.9 points per game, is averaging 25.0 points and 8.2 rebounds over the last six.

• **Texas Southern** (11-11, 8-1 SWAC). has caught **Alabama State** at the top of the **SWAC** standings after wins over ASU and **Alabama A&M**.

Madarius Gibbs had 24 points to lead the Tigers to a 80-65 win over Alabama State Saturday. Every one of TSU's nine players shot above 50% from the field except starter **Tonnie Collier** who was 2 of 5. TSU finished shooting 54.5% for the game. Gibbs shot 10 of 20 from the field and had six rebounds. **Malcolm Riley** had 17 points on 5 of 9 shooting including 3 of 4 from behind the arc, and led the Tigers with 8 rebounds. **Jamel Waters** led ASU with 16 points.

TSU needed overtime to subdue A&M, 68-65 Monday. The teams were deadlocked at 29 at halftime and at 61 at the end of regulation. A&M was doomed by 1-for-8 shooting in the extra pe-

riod while TSU got a putback dunk from **Nick Shepherd** to take its first lead at 66-65. Gibbs added two free throws for the final margin. Collier had 18 points and Gibbs got 17 and 10 boards to lead TSU. Riley added 15. **Laradarius Tabb** had 16 points and 13 rebounds to pace A&M.

• **Morehouse** (11-9, 9-3 SIAC E) came from ten points down at the half and scored on **Javarius Gay**'s layup with 11 seconds left to hand **Paine** its first **SIAC** loss, 62-61 Saturday.

The Maroon Tigers were still down seven, 59-52 with 2:44 left before closing on a 9-1 run. Six-one freshman guard **Tyrius Walker**, who led the Tigers with a game-high 21 points, began the run with a 3-pointer at the 1:36 mark and then added a layup a half-minute later to pull them within 59-57. After a Paine free throw, a 3-pointer by **Caleb Boykin** pulled Morehouse within 61-60 with 51 ticks left. After Paine missed with 22 seconds left, Gay rebounded a missed 3 from Walker and put it up and in for the winning points. Paine scoring leader **Denzel Dillingham** missed a layup with 3 seconds left. Dillingham led Paine with 23 points on 9 of 22 shooting.

Morehouse was tied with Paine (14-5, 10-2 SIAC E) at 9-2 atop the East Division until the tables were turned on the Maroon Tigers Monday suffering a last-second 60-58 loss to **Fort Valley State**. FVSU guard **Desmond Lofland** scored on a layup, his only points of the game, with just :02 seconds left to give the Wildcats (2-17, 2-10 E) the win, only their second of the season. FVSU came back from a 34-17 halftime deficit to pull it out. Walker again led Morehouse with 16 points. **Derrick Spear** had a game-high 19 to lead FVSU.

• The women of **Livingstone** improved to 20-0 overall, 12-0 in the **CIAA** and 6-0 in the South Division with wins over **Saint Augustines** (96-73) and **Winston-Salem State** (64-56) this past week. Head coach **Anita Howard**'s Lady Blue Bears are up to eighth (8th) in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) national Div. II poll this week. They received one first-place vote.

Cierra York had 23 points in the SAU win. **Precious Roberts** had 16 in the win over WSSU.
