## BIG WINNERS!

- Virginia Union • Kentucky State • Grambling State • NC A&T
- NC Central • Benedict & Albany State • Florida A&M

• **VIRGINIA UNION** - The Panthers (5-3, 4-1, 2-1 N) went down 21-0 in the first quarter, scored 21 second-quarter points and then added 21 second-half points including the game-winning TD early in the fourth quarter to down BCSP No. 9 **Bowie State** 42-35 and tighten up the CIAA North Division standings.

BSU and VUU entered the fourth quarter tied at 35 but the Panthers drove 75 yards in 10 plays to score on a 2-yard pass from QB **Shawheem Dowdy** (17 of 25, 284 yards, 3 TDs) to **Aaquil Ingram-Harrow**. Dowdy earlier threw TD passes to **Gustavious Dames** of 20 yards and 72 yards to **Lavataie Kelly**. VUU RB **William Stanback**, the CIAA's leading rusher at 128.0 yards per game, ran 32 times for 194 yards and TDs of 21, 2 and 1 yard.

BSU (5-3, 4-1, 2-1 N), who came in undefeated in conference and divisional play, got 295 passing yards and three first-quarter TDs from QB **Amir Hall** (18-29-1).

• **KENTUCKY STATE** - **Kentucky State** defenders blocked a **Tuskegee** attempt at a tying extra point with under 90 seconds left and then blocked an attempt at a game-winning 18-yard field goal in the final seconds to preserve a stunning 10-9 win over previously undefeated **Tuskegee** (6-1, 4-1, 1-1 SIAC W). This gives new KSU head coach **John L. Smith** and the Thorobreds back-to-back wins over defending West Division and league champion **Miles** and undefeated Tuskegee.

Tuskegee had driven 71 yards in 11 plays to score on a 1-yard **Jerome Lewis** run 1:25 left. TU's **Dalton Hall's** PAT attempt to tie the game at 10 was blocked by junior defensive lineman **Donovan Cecil**. After the kickoff and a KSU three-and-out, Tuskegee's **Desmond Reece** returned a KSU punt to the KSU 15. A personal foul took the ball to the KSU 8. After two running plays, the KSU team was credited with the game-saving block from 18 yards out.

After a first-quarter Tuskegee field goal, the Golden Tigers botched a punt midway thru the second quarter that KSU recovered at the TU 9. Two plays later, KSU QB **Jules St. Gee** scored on a 2-yard run to give the Thorobreds a 7-3 lead. They took that lead into the half.

In the third quarter, KSU recovered a fumble by Tuskegee QB **Kevin Lacey**. Seven plays later, Rose kicked thru a 29-yard field goal for a 10-3 lead.

• **BCSP NO. 2 GRAMBLING STATE** - The G-Men (4-1, 4-0 SWAC W) had little trouble with **Mississippi Valley State** ruining the Delta Devils' (0-8, 0-6 E) homecoming with a 59-10 whipping.

Grambling QB **Devante Kincade** was 20 of 27 for 326 yards and four TDs (40, 47, 25, 26). The first two TDs went to **Dominique Leake** who had four receptions for 109 yards. RB **Martez Carter** had 9 carries for 91 rushing yards including a 35-yard TD run and also caught a 25-yard TD pass.

**BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T** - The Aggies (6-1, 4-0 MEAC) jumped up early at **Howard's** homecoming and never looked back in claiming a 34-7 win.

QB **Lamar Raynard** was 13 of 18 for 191 yards and three TDs (3, 45, 9) while RB **Tarik Cohen** ran 20 times for 133 yards including a 16-yard TD run. Cohen also scored on a 45-yard catch and run early in the third quarter.

The Aggie defense held Howard (1-7, 1-4) RB **Anthony Philyaw**, the MEAC's second leading rusher behind Cohen, to just 27 yards on 17 carries. The Bison avoided the shutout by scoring in the

game's final minutes.

• **BCSP No. 3 NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** - The Eagles (6-2, 5-0 MEAC) put together a late TD drive to post a come-from-behind 21-17 win at **Morgan State's** homecoming Saturday.

Despite losing starting QB **Malcolm Bell** in the first half and trailing 17-14 at the half, the Eagles took advantage of a short punt to score with 3:59 left in the game. It was the only score for either team in the second half.

The scoring drive followed a 18-yard punt by MSU's **Alex Raya** that gave NCCU the ball at the MSU 39. Back-up QB, redshirt freshman **Naill Ramadan** (6-8-1, 94 yards) led the scoring drive that culminated with his 16-yard pass to WR **Jalen Wilkes**. Ramadan completed passes of 4, 13, 7 and 16 yards in the drive.

NCCU had gone up early 14-0 on Bell's 38-yard pass to **LaVontis Smith** in the game's first possession and **Dorrel McClain's** 2-yard run that came after MSU QB **Chris Andrews** was intercepted at the MSU 22.

MSU came back to score 17 unanswered points on Andrews' 12-yard pass to **Ricky Fisk** in the first quarter, a 7-yard second-quarter scoring run by **Eric Harrell** and Raya's 40-yard field goal as the first half ended. Harrell rushed for 121 yards on 21 carries.

The NCCU defense shut out MSU in the second half getting one interception and one fumble recovery.

- **BENEDICT & ALBANY STATE** - **Benedict** (4-4, 3-2, 2-1 E) and **Albany State** (4-3, 3-1, 2-0) both won at their homecomings to set up a showdown for the **SIAC** East Division lead this week in Augusta, Ga.

Benedict got 166 rushing yards from **George Myers** and two short TD runs from QB **Phillip Brown** in downing **Morehouse** 13-10.

Albany State QB **Caleb Edmonds** (16-36-1) threw for 232 yards and one TD and ran for another in the Golden Rams' 17-7 win over **Clark Atlanta**.

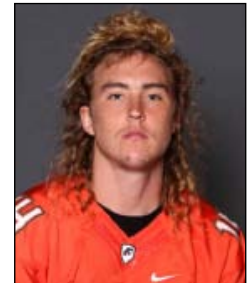
• **FLORIDA A&M** - The Rattlers (3-5, 3-2) and second-year coach **Alex Wood** won their third game in four tries with a 31-14 homecoming win over **Hampton** (3-4, 3-2).

Freshman QB **Ryan Stanley** (18-31-1, 212 yards) threw for the Rattlers' first two TDs. He opened the scoring on an 18-yard pass to **Louben Polinice** in the game's first possession. He hit **Branndon Norwood** in the third quarter to break a 7-all tie and put the Rattlers up 14-7. The Rattlers then recovered a Hampton fumble and got a 26-yard **Colby Blanton** field goal to lead 17-7.

The lead went to 24-7 on **Han's Supre's** 2-yard run at the end of a 13-play, 43-yard drive. The Rattler's later picked off Hampton QB **Jaylan Williamson** and scored on **Tevin Spells' 2-yard** TD.

• BCSP No. 5 **Tuskegee** was knocked and shocked as the only unbeaten team by **Kentucky State**, 10-9 (see above).

**Bowie State** was handed its first **CIAA** loss at **Virginia Union**, 42-35. **Elizabeth City State** stunned BCSP No. 10 **Chowan** 40-21 to forge a four-way tie atop the **CIAA** North between ECSU, Virginia State, Virginia Union and Bowie State all at 2-1 in N. Div. play.

• **BETHUNE-COOKMAN** - The Wildcats (1-5, 1-3 MEAC) scored all 21 of its points in the first half and held on for a 21-14 win over **Norfolk State** (1-6, 0-4).

B-CU threw three picks, one each by QB **Larry Brihm**, back-up QB **Akevious Williams** and punter **Jonathan Cagle** but did get a Brihm TD pass to **Jawill Davis** to open the scoring. After giving up a 43-yard TD run to NSU QB **Greg Hankerson** that tied the score at 7, Williams scored on a 7-yard second-quarter run and **Cameron Rigby** scored later in the second period on an 11-yard run.

NSU pulled within 21-14 early in the fourth quarter on **Quintrell Chung's** 11-yard run. NSU got two possessions in the final minutes but both drives were stopped in B-CU territory.

• **SHAW** - The Bears (1-7, 1-4) got a 2-yard **Uriah Bethea** touchdown midway thru the final period to down **Johnson C. Smith** 11-8 for its first win of the year.

# WORTH NOTING

## – THE 5,000-YARD MAN - North Carolina A&T senior

RB **Tarik Cohen** became the first 5,000-yard rusher in MEAC history and only the second MEAC player to rush for 1,000 yards in four straight years after his 133-yard effort Saturday at the **Howard** homecoming.

Cohen rushed for 133 yards on 20 carries in the 34-7 Aggies' win. The effort raised his 2016 total to 1,023 yards, his fourth straight year topping the 1,000-yard mark. Only **Hampton's Alonzo Coleman** had accomplished the feat before in MEAC history.

The output also raised Cohen's MEAC-record career total to 5,054 yards, the first MEAC runner in history to top the 5,000-yard plateau. He also moved past former **Virginia Union** RB **Andre Braxton** into fourth on the all-time HBCU rushing list. Cohen needs just four yards to move past **Tennessee State** RB **Charles Anthony**

– **FOBBS RE-UPS AT GRAMBLING STATE** - **Grambling State** head football coach **Broderick Fobbs** has signed a new two-year extension.

The agreement guarantees Fobbs \$195,000, the salary he has earned since 2013. Fobbs said he did not want to accept a salary increase since the university is facing significant financial challenges. The contract includes additional compensation for Fobbs and his staff for specific goals like coach of the year honors, the SWAC West Division title, SWAC championship, meeting or exceeding APR and other academic goals, Celebration Bowl and black college national championships.
