• **FORT VALLEY STATE** - The Wildcats, who lost six of their first seven games, won their third straight, coming back from a 17-0 halftime deficit to knock off **Albany State** 21-17 and claim the **SIAC** East Division title and berth in next week's league championship game.

FVSU will face West Division winner **Kentucky State** (4-6) Saturday in Montgomery, Alabama's Cramton Bowl in the title game.

Playing before a Fountain City Classic crowd of 13,523 in Columbus, Ga., FVSU (4-6, 3-1) began its comeback on its first second-half possession driving 72 yards in seven plays and scoring on a 18-yard pass from **Otis Brown** to **Bodarius Johnson**. The comeback continued in the first fourth-quarter possession as **Samuel Ryan** recovered a fumble by ASU QB **Caleb Edmonds** in the end zone to cut the lead to 17-14.

The game-winner came on the Wildcats' next possession as Brown hit Johnson on a 39-yard scoring pass with 9:45 to play.

ASU (5-4, 3-1) had scored on two first-quarter runs of 4 and 1 yards by **Trayvon Vallery** and a 20-yard **Emilio Maldonado** 20-yard field goal.

• **BCSP No. 10 BOWIE STATE** - The Bulldogs rushed for 319 yards and passed for 338 yards as they claimed the CIAA North Division title and spot in next week's championship game vs. South Division champ **Winston-Salem State** with a 56-7 pasting of **Elizabeth City State**.

The championship game is Saturday in Salem, Va.

BSU (7-3, 6-1 CIAA) needed to win the game to clinch the division crown and they left no doubt. QB **Amir Hall** completed 18 of 27 passes for 296 yards and three TDs. Running back **Robert Chesson** ran for 223 yards on 17 carries and two TDs in the rout.

BSU was up 21-0 after the first quarter and 35-7 at the half.

• **BCSP NO. 2 GRAMBLING STATE** - Quarterback **Devante Kincade** completed 19 of 35 passes for 238 yards and four TDs and running back **Jestin Kelly** carried 23 times for 200 yards and a score in **Grambling State's** 56-17 win over **Alabama A&M**.

GSU (6-1, 6-0) wide receiver **Chad Williams**, the SWAC's top receiver, had six receptions for 97 yards and scoring receptions of 19 and 29 yards and also ran for a 3-yard score.

**BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T** - The Aggies (8-1, 6-0 MEAC) reclaimed the lead late in the fourth quarter on a 9-yard touchdown reception by **Elijah Bell** and then scored on a 29-yard interception return by **Marquis Willis** to put away **South Carolina State**, 30-20.

SCSU (3-5, 3-2) had taken a 20-16 lead on a 1-yard run by QB **Caleb York** with 1:56 left in the third quarter. That score followed a 46-yard pass from York to **Quan Caldwell** that carried to the A&T 1. York, who replaced starter **Adrian Kollock** in second quarter, had hit **De'Montre Burroughs** on a 41-yard score with two seconds left in the half to pull the Bulldogs within 16-13.

A&T scored on the game's first possession on star running back **Tarik Cohen's** 15-yard run, his first-ever TD vs. SC State. Cohen, who has never run

for 100 yards in four games vs. SCSU, finished with 57 yards on 16 carries. **Cody Jones** hit a 21-yard field goal to put the Aggies up 10-0 before Kollock scored on a 17-yard run at the first quarter buzzer to get the Bulldogs on the board, trailing 10-6.

Bell (3 rec., 61 yds, 2 TDs) caught a 25-yard TD pass from QB **Lamar Raynard** to give the Aggies a 16-6 lead early in the second quarter before York hit on his first TD pass.

**BCSP NO. 3 CENTRAL - Ramone Simpson** ran for 112 yards including a 24-yard scoring run and QB **Malcolm Bell** (17-31-1, 223 yards) threw for two scores as the Eagles (7-2, 6-0 MEAC) kept pace with NC A&T in the MEAC race with a 38-19 win over **Delaware State**.

NCCU also scored on a 19-yard interception return by **Reggie Hunter** and a 90-yard punt return by **Mike Jones** in the win. DSU scored two late fourth-quarter scores to make the final score respectable.

**BCSP NO. 4 SOUTHERN - The Jaguars** (6-2, 6-0 SWAC) picked off three **Averion Hurts** passes and scored on a four-quarter fumble recovery to put away **Texas Southern** 26-10.

Southern QB **Austin Howard** completed 18 of 33 passes for 226 yards but had a first-quarter pass intercepted by **Jarius Moore** and returned 73 yards for the game's first touchdown.

Down 7-0, Southern got a 3-yard run from SWAC career rushing leader **Lenard Tillery** to tie the game at 7. Tillery rushed for 125 yards on 22 carries. SU got a 1-yard run from **H. Edwards** to lead 14-7 at the break. After TSU's **Eric Medina** added a third-quarter field goal, **R. Albuquerque** answered with a 28-yard field goal before **J. Abby's** fumble recovery give the Jags a 23-10 lead.

Albuquerque added a 28-yard field goal late.

**BCSP NO. 5 PRAIRIE VIEW A&M - Quarterback Jalen Morton** ran for two scores and threw for two scores while fighting off three interceptions to lead **Prairie View A&M** (6-3, 6-1) to a 31-27 see-saw win over defending SWAC champion **Alcorn State** (3-5, 3-4).

Alcorn State jumped up 14-0 on **DeLance Turner's** 8-yard first-quarter run and QB **Noah Johnson's** 79-yard scoring jaunt with 5:11 left in the second quarter. **Morton** hit **Sta'fon McCray** with a 6-yard scoring pass with :32 seconds left in the half to get the Panthers on the board. PV then recovered an onside kick and drove to score on a **Armaury Martine** 32-yard field goal to pull within 14-10 as the halftime clock expired.

PV went up 17-14 on Morton's 13-yard run on the opening possession of the third quarter. Johnson came back to put Alcorn up 21-17 on his 9-yard run with 8:53 left in the quarter. PV went back on top 24-21 on Morton's 44-yard toss to **Darius Floyd** and then added a 1-yard TD run by Morton to take a 31-21 lead. Johnson's 16-yard run with 6:46 to play pulled Alcorn within 31-27. Johnson ran for 123 yards and three TDs.

Alcorn got the ball back twice in the final minutes but Johnson was 0-for-7 trying to move the ball.

**BCSP NO. 9 TENNESSEE STATE - Quarterback Ronald Butler** hit freshman wide receiver **Steven Newbold** on a 21-yard TD reception with two seconds left and **Lane Parker's** PAT allowed the Tigers to knock off Austin Peay, 41-40.

Austin Peay, who rushed for 322 yards in the game, scored three unanswered second-half touchdowns to come back from a 34-19 deficit and go up 40-34 with 1:05 left. TSU drove 81 yards in eight plays over the final 1:05 to pull out the win. Butler completed 12 of 23 passes for 212 yards and four TDs (20, 27, 39 and 21) while also running ten times for 130 yards and two scores of 13 and 84 yards. Newbold (4 rec., 72 yds.) had two of the scoring grabs including a 20-yarder in the first quarter.

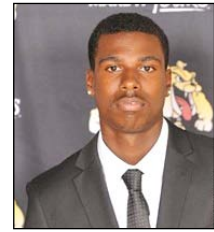
