• **CIAA WINNERS** - The six winners of CIAA games Saturday averaged 43 points compared to 11 points for the losers. The top scoring CIAA team was **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** (3-2, 2-1 CIAA S). The Rams rushed for 406 yards in a 51-10 win over **Lincoln (Pa.)** (1-4, 0-2 N). Running backs **Kerrion Moore** (9 carries, 179 yards, 3 TDs) and **Te'Vaughn Hurse** (20 carries, 125 yards, 1 TD) both topped 100 rushing yards and scored four TDs between them in the win.

- **VIRGINIA UNION** - The Panthers (3-2, 2-0 N) reached the half-century mark primarily via the pass in a 50-21 win over **Saint Augustine's** (1-4, 1-1 S). Quarterback **Shawheem Dowdy** (18-33-1, 247 yards) threw for five touchdowns (16, 20, 10, 18 and 46 yards) while RB **William Stanback** ran for 159 yards and one TD. Three of Dowdy's scoring passes went to **Levatia Kelly** covering 16, 20 and 46 yards.

- **CHOWAN** and **VIRGINIA STATE** both put up 47 points in their wins. Chowan (4-1, 2-0 N) got five TD passes from QB **Randall Dixon** (26-34-1, 381 yards) and 191 rushing yards and two TDs from RB **Tyree Lee** in a 47-14 win over **Johnson C. Smith**. VSU (4-1, 1-1 N) had five rushing TDs, posted seven sacks, two interceptions and two fumbles in a 47-0 shutout of **Livingstone**.

- **BOWIE STATE** - The CIAA scoring leader Bulldogs (3-2, 2-0 N) did most of their scoring damage on the ground in a 37-3 win over **Fayetteville State**. RB **Robert Chesson** had scoring runs of 1, 4 and 1 yards finishing off drives set up by freshman QB **Amir Hall's** 422 passing yards (29-51-1, 1 TD). The Bulldogs put up 581 total yards while holding FSU to 164 yards.

- **ELIZABETH CITY STATE** - The Vikings (2-3, 1-1 N) scored on QB **Daquan Neal's** 15-yard fourth-quarter run to pull out a 28-21 win over **Shaw**. Neal (21-27-0, 201 yards) also threw two scoring passes.

• **CLARK ATLANTA** - CAU placekicker **Carlos Saldana** kicked thru a 35-yard field goal as time expired to give the Panthers () a come-from-behind 37-36 win over **Morehouse** in the AU Center battle.

CAU scored the last 23 points of the game, 16 in the fourth quarter, to wipe out a 36-14 third-quarter deficit. The three touchdowns during the run came via QB **Johnathan McCrary** who finished 27 of 45 for 456 yards and five TDs (5, 35, 48, 17 and 9 yards). Freshman WR **Dre Martin** finished with 7 receptions for 238 yards and three TDs, the last two during the fourth-quarter comeback. McCrary is a Vanderbilt transfer.

• **BCSP NO. 7 TUSKEGEE** - The Golden Tigers (5-0, 4-0 SIAC W) stayed undefeated but needed a furious fourth-quarter comeback to knock off previously unbeaten UNC-Pembroke, 21-16.

UNC-P was ahead 16-0 with six minutes to play before TU scored twice in the space of 19 seconds and put up three scores in less than five minutes.

The Tigers pulled to within 16-8 on **Jayjerian Craig's** 8-yard TD run and a two-point conversion. After the kickoff, **Osband Thompson** and **Kalil Gray** stripped UNC-P QB Patrick O'Brian with

Thompson recovering at the UNC-P 18-yard line. One play later, TU QB **Kevin Lacey** hit **Desmond Reece** with an 18-yard TD pass to pull TU within 16-14 after a failed two-point conversion. Tuskegee got the ball back and scored on another Lacey to Reece scoring pass, this one from 65 yards out to put the Tigers up 21-16 after the PAT with 3:55 left. The final UNC-P drive was halted by an interception.

• **BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T** - Dynamic senior running back **Tarik Cohen** ran for 256 yards on 26 carries and scored on runs of 15, 30 and 94 yards in the Aggies (3-1, 1-0 MEAC) 31-9 win over **Hampton** (1-3, 1-1).

It was the fifth 200-yard rushing day in Cohen's career, his 23rd 100-yard rushing effort and brought him within less than 200 yards of becoming the MEAC's all-time leading rusher. He rushed for 204 yards and all three scores in the second half.

• **BCSP NO. 3 NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** - The Eagles (3-2, 2-0 MEAC) got two touchdown passes and one scoring run from QB **Malcolm Bell** (15-29-1, 295 yards) in a 31-14 win that kept **Bethune-Cookman** winless (0-4, 0-2 MEAC).

After giving up an early touchdown, NCCU scored 24 straight points including waiting thru a 2-hour weather delay. After the Wildcats scored a late fourth-quarter TD, RB **Ramone Simpson** closed out the scoring with a 40-yard scoring run with just under two minutes left. Simpson finished with 116 rushing yards on 19 carries.

• **BCSP NO. 2 GRAMBLING STATE** - The G-Men (3-1, 3-0 SWAC W) bounced back from an early 16-0 deficit to score the game's final 36 points to post a 36-16 win over BCSP No. 4 **Prairie View A&M** (3-2, 3-1 W) before a season-high crowd of 53,182 at the *State Fair Classic* in the Cotton Bowl in Dallas.

QB **Devante Kincade** (17-30-0, 207 yards) scored on 11- and 14-yard runs and hit **Chad Williams** with a 13-yard scoring pass. RB **Jestin Kelly** scored on two 2-yard scoring runs and rushed for 117 yards on 20 carries. Meanwhile, the Grambling defense picked off PV A&M QB **Trey Green** three times.

After surrendering 16 points and 187 yards in the first quarter, Grambling limited PV to 102 yards for the rest of the game.

• **BCSP NO. 5 TENNESSEE STATE** - The Tigers (4-0, 1-0 OVC) scored on a 9-yard pass from QB **Ronald Butler** to wide receiver **Patrick Smith** with just :18 seconds left to knock off UT-Martin 34-30 and remain unbeaten.

Butler (17-24-0, 223 yards, 3 TDs), playing after starter **O'Shay Ackerman-Carter** was lost last week to a season-ending knee injury, led the scoring drive after UT-M had gone ahead 30-27 on a 20-yard TD pass with two minutes left. He led TSU on a 7-play, 74-yard drive culminating with the scoring toss to Smith in the left corner of the end zone. TSU had fallen behind 16-0 early but came back to take a 17-16 lead on Smith's 1-yard TD reception in the third quarter. The teams exchanged the lead in the fourth quarter twice. TSU placekicker **Lane Clark** broke the school record for field goals twice in the game, connecting from 54 yards in the second quarter and then from 57 yards in the fourth period.

• **HOWARD** - The Bison (1-4, 1-2 MEAC) trailed 21-6 after the first quarter but roared back to scored 27 consecutive points and knock off **Norfolk State** (1-4, 0-2) 33-28 for their first win.

Howard QB **Kalen Johnson** completed 18 of 27 passes for 150 yards without an interception and two scores, 11 and 8 yards to **Anthony Kyle**, in the comeback win. **Anthony Philyaw** ran for 115 yards including a 1-yard scoring run. NSU senior QB **Greg Hankerson** threw for 366 yards (25-35-1) and two scores (64 and 59 yards) and ran for another two scores (9 and 3 yards) in the loss.

• **ALABAMA STATE** - The Hornets (1-4, 1-3 SWAC E) got two rushing touchdowns and one passing score from QB **Quinteris Toppings** in its first win, 41-21 over **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** (1-4, 1-2 W). RB **Khalid Thomas** ran 22 times for 143 yards and two scores (2 and 6 yards). UAPB QB **Brandon Duncan** was 29 of 38 for 380 yards and two TDs. The bulk of those yards were to **Willie Young** (8 rec., 117 yds., 1 TD) and **Cody Swain** (7 rec., 142 yds.)

• **FLORIDA A&M** - The Rattlers (1-4, 1-1 MEAC) got their first win as they held off **Savannah State** (1-3, 1-1), 19-14. FAMU QB **Ryan Stanley** was an efficient 21 of 30 for 230 yard and one touchdown, a 21-yard pass to **Tevin Spells** to open the scoring. Spells later added a 1-yard scoring run.

Keyes, a wide receiver, scored the Aggies first TD on a 3-yard pass reception. It was the 19th scoring reception of Keyes' career, tying him with former tight end **Craig Thompson's** A&T record.

Cohen ran for three scores. The first one gave him the Aggies' career rushing TD record, surpassing

CIAA to move eight of ten championships out of N. C.

Charlotte, NC (September 30, 2016) - In a meeting held by the 12 members of the **Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association** (CIAA) Board of Directors, a decision was reached to immediately relocate 8 of the 10 North Carolina-based conference championships. Due to time constraints, particularly as they relate to contractual obligations, the 2017 CIAA Women's and Men's Basketball Tournament will remain in Charlotte as relocation would not be in the best interest of the membership and its student-athletes at this time.

The CIAA's transition, beginning with the relocation of 8 championships, is the first step in demonstrating that the conference does not support laws which prevent communities from effectively protecting student-athletes and fans. For the 2017 Basketball Tournament, the CIAA will focus its resources to enhance the student-athlete experience in-venue with collaborative efforts aligning with the Charlotte community to highlight diversity, in-

clusion, youth education, and leadership. The Board will continue its discussion on hosting future championships in North Carolina and whether the tournament will remain after 2017.

The CIAA Board recognizes that a single decision cannot offer a complete solution to a law that prevents communities from effectively protecting student-athletes and fans attending championships and events. The conference intends to increase its educational efforts to eliminate biases that exclude or marginalize any human being, regardless of one's race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender, or physical disability. The Board's decision allows the conference to fight against any measures which prevent the fulfillment of its mission to foster inclusive cultures for its student-athletes. With the student-athlete experience in mind, the conference is committed to protecting all of its championship events.

Official announcements from the CIAA regarding new championship locations will be forth coming.
