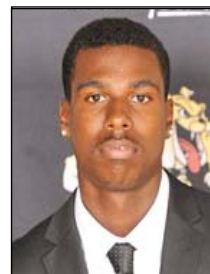

• **BCSP No. 9 BOWIE STATE** - Scoring 21 first-half points was enough for **Bowie State** (3-2, 2-0, 1-0 N) as they defeated **Chowan** 21-14 in a key CIAA North Division game played on Thursday because of weather issues from Hurricane Matthew.

Black college passing leader **Amir Hall** (18-37-1) threw two first-half TD passes (10, 20) sandwiched around **Brandon Abrams'** 4-yard first-quarter TD run as the Bulldogs went up 21-0. Chowan (3-2, 1-1, 0-1) scored late in the second quarter on **Randall Dixon's** 59-yard pass to **Ryan Nolan**. Dixon (12-27-0, 195 yards) added a fourth-quarter TD pass to **Torry Baker** but could not score again.

Chowan RB **Tyree Lee** ran for 158 yards on 30 carries.

• **BCSP NO. 5 TUSKEGEE** - The Golden Tigers (6-0, 4-0 1-0 SIAC W) got four touchdown passes from quarterback **Kevin Lacey** (18-29-1, 300 yards) to overcome key mistakes that led to touchdowns in downing **Morehouse** 28-19 at the *81st Morehouse-Skeege Classic* before a crowd of 23,612 in Columbus, Ga.

Tuskegee led 7-0 at the half on Lacey's first TD pass, a 16-yarder to **Leo Gilbert** and stretched that lead to 14-0 on Lacey's 60-yard bomb to **Desmond Reece** midway thru the third quarter. Morehouse (2-4, 1-3) got on the board on QB **Monqavious Johnson's** 9-yard third-quarter TD run and after the kickoff, scored one play later on **David Smith's** 28-yard return of a Lacey fumble. A missed PAT by **Alexis Gonzalez** left them trailing 14-13.

Lacey then hooked up with **Dekendrick Moncrief** from 30 yards out to increase the lead to 21-13 with 3:29 left in the third quarter before Morehouse's **Jordan Tarver** picked up another Lacey fumble and ran 10 yards to paydirt to pull the Maroon Tigers within 21-19. A two-point conversion try failed on the final play of the third quarter.

Lacey closed out the scoring with an 8-yard pass to **Javarius Cheatham** early in the fourth quarter.

BCSP NO. 8 PRAIRIE VIEW A&M - **Prairie View A&M** tied **Alabama State** at 17 on a 37-yard **Owen Hoolihan** field goal with :37 seconds left and won it in overtime on a **Caleb Broach** 1-yard run to down the Hornets, 24-17.

ASU (1-5, 1-4 SWAC E) led 17-7 at the break but was shut out in the second half and overtime. Meanwhile, PV (4-2, 4-1) got a third quarter TD on a **Jalen Morton** 1-yard run before tying it in the final seconds on the field goal following a 14-play, 79-yard drive.

Prairie View got the ball first in the OT. The game-winning score came after Broach ran for 13 yards to the ASU 2 before fumbling and recovering the fumble in the end zone. The PV defense then stopped ASU on four downs that included consecutive sacks to end the game.

• **BCSP NO. 10 VIRGINIA UNION** - The Panthers (3-2, 2-0, 1-0 N) got 142 rushing yards (17 carries) and three touchdowns from black college rushing leader **William Stanback** on two runs (4, 37) and a 53-yard pass reception in downing **Lincoln (Pa.)** 36-9.

VUU QB **Shawheem Dowdy** (16-24-1) passed for 219 yards and three TDs and ran for a score in the win. The other two TD passes went to **Chazio McKenzie** covering 12 and 27 yards.

• **BCSP NO. 3 NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** - A 25-yard fourth-quarter scoring run by RB **Dorrel McClain** enabled BCSP No. 3 **North Carolina Central** to escape with a 17-13 home win over **Florida A&M** Saturday.

FAMU (1-5, 1-2 MEAC) had taken a 13-10 fourth-quarter lead on **Devin Bowers'** 18-yard scoring run with 6:11 left. That score came after NCCU muffed a punt deep in its own territory. NCCU got the ball back after a **Mike Jones** 28-yard return and needed five plays to score on McClain's run.

On its last possession, FAMU penetrated to the NCCU 46 before turning the ball over on downs. FAMU led 5-3 at the half after getting a first-quarter safety and 34-yard **Colby Blanton** field goal to offset NCCU's **Brandon McLaren's** 33-yard field goal. NCCU (4-2, 3-0) took a 10-5 lead on **Malcolm Bell's** 42-yard pass to **LaVontis Smith** early in the fourth quarter.

- **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** - The Rams got three field goals from placekicker **Will Johnson** (38, 49, 21) and a game-winning touchdown on a 1-yard run by **Kerrion Moore** to get a comeback 15-14 win over **Johnson C. Smith**.

The Johnson field goals staked the Rams (4-2, 3-0, 1-0 S) to a 6-0 halftime lead and 9-0 lead into the third quarter. But JCSU (1-5, 1-2, 0-1 S) got two TD passes from QB **Harold Herbin** (12-27-2, 213 yards) to take a 14-9 lead early in the fourth quarter. He first hit **Roderick Carter** on a 63-yard third-quarter yard scoring strike and then connected with **Gabriel Yuille** from 38 yards out for the go-ahead score eight seconds into the final period.

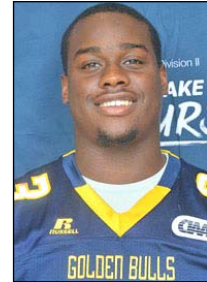
WSSU's game-winning drive covered 85 yards in 18 plays and took 8:20 off the clock. The Rams scored with 3:17 to play. **Te'Vaughn Hurse** led the Rams with 199 yards on 21 carries.

JCSU got the ball back twice but was unable to secure a first down.

• **BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T** - Dynamic senior running back **Tarik Cohen** had his second straight 200-yard game, the sixth of his career, rushing for 202 yards on 23 carries as the Aggies (4-1, 2-0 MEAC) shut out **Norfolk State** Thursday night, 35-0. Cohen's 62-yard scoring run in the third quarter pushed him past the 200-yard mark in the game and also put him past the MEAC career rushing record.

Cohen, who already has three 1,000-yard seasons under his belt, increased his career total to 4,701 yards, surpassing the MEAC career record of 4,660 yards held by **Wil Ford** of **South Carolina State** set during his career from 2006-09. Cohen tops the MEAC with 670 rushing yards, 134.0 yards per game, this season.

The A&T defense held Norfolk State (1-5, 0-3) to seven first downs and 26 rushing yards in pitching a shutout.

• **Tennessee State**

• **BCSP NO. 4 TENNESSEE STATE** - Despite 303 passing yards and two scoring throws from QB **Ronald Butler** (15-27-1), Tennessee State (4-1, 1-1 OVC) was knocked from the unbeaten ranks by Eastern Illinois (4-2, 2-1), 35-34.

Butler connected on TD passes to **Patrick Smith** of 56 yards and 44 yards to **Steven Newbold** in the second half, the second putting the Tigers up 34-28 with 14:48 to play. EIU came back to score on a 10-play, 80-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD pass to go up 35-34. Smith (7 rec., 160 yds.) and Newbold (4 rec., 121 yds.) both topped 100 receiving yards.

TSU drove to the EIU 29 before **Lane Clark**, who had converted on 37- and 52-yard field goals, was wide left on a 46-yard attempt with 3 minutes left. TSU got the ball back once more and drove to their own 44 as time expired.

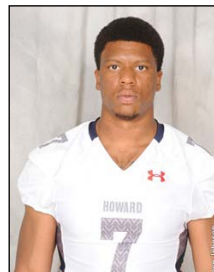

Players, Stats Worth Watching

- MO' RECORDS - North

Carolina A&T seniors **Tarik Cohen** and **Denzel Keyes** contined their assault on record books during the Aggies' 35-0 shutout of **Norfolk State** Thursday.

Keyes, a wide receiver, caught a 3-yard scoring pass in the third quarter to become the Aggies' all-time TD receiving leader. Keyes now has 20 TD receptions, topping the 19 set by former A&T tight end **Craig Thompson**.

Cohen's 62-yard TD run early in the fourth quarter propelled him past **South Carolina State's Wil Ford** as the leading rusher in MEAC history with 4,701 yards.

Cohen is now fifth all-time among black college rushers. **Winston-Salem State** RB **Richard Huntley** is the career leader with 6,286 yards. Cohen needs, and could reach, 451 yards to catch and surpass former **Albany State** RB **Antonio Leroy** for second place. He needs 1,561 yards over the remainder of his career to catch Huntley.

Cohen is now 24th in all-time FCS rushing yards. The ca-

reer FCS leader is former Georgia Southern RB Adrian Peterson who ran for 6,559 yards from 1998-2001.

Cohen has six regular season games and potentially a bowl game berth (*Celebration Bowl*) left in his illustrious career. He needs less than 299 yards to become the MEAC's first 5,000-yard rusher. He would have to average over 250 yards per game to catch either Huntley or Peterson.
