BIG WINNERS!

It was a great week for quarterback/running back combinations as NC A&T, Southern and Chowan rode tandem play to wins.

• **BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T** - Dynamic senior running back **Tarik Cohen** had his third straight 200-yard game, the seventh of his career, rushing for 220 yards on 25 carries with three TDs (87, 11, 8) as the Aggies (5-1, 3-0 MEAC) outscored **Bethune-Cookman** 52-35. A&T also got 277 passing yards and three TDs from QB **Lamar Raynard** (20-31-1).

The Aggies had to survive a Wildcat passing attack led by junior QB **Larry Brihm** who completed 23 of 42 passes for 376 yards and four TDs. Three of his TD passes went to WR **Frank Brown** who finished with five receptions for 117 yards. Fellow wideout **Jawill Davis** hauled in nine passes for 143 yards.

After trailing 21-14 at the half and 24-21 after three quarters, B-CU scored twice early in the fourth quarter to go up 35-31 with 12:11 left. The Aggies scored the final 21 points, the go-ahead score on a 37-yard pass from Raynard to WR **Elijah Bell** that put the Aggies up 38-35. **Jeremy Taylor** padded the lead with an interception return for a TD on first down of B-CU's possession following the kickoff. Cohen capped the scoring with his 8-yard run.

• **BCSP No. 3 NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** - The NC Central Eagles kept pace in the MEAC race with a relatively easy 33-3 win over **Savannah State**.

QB **Malcolm Bell** had a hand in three of the Eagles' (5-2, 4-0 MEAC) four touchdowns passing for 336 yards (28-38) and two TDs and running for a score. Bell however, threw five interceptions. But the Tigers could not capitalize on any of them. The other NCCU TD came on **Mike Jones'** 59-yard four-quarter punt return.

The NCCU defense limited SSU (1-4, 1-2) to 141 total yards.

• **BCSP NO. 9 BOWIE STATE** - Trailing 37-26 with six minutes left in the third quarter, the Bulldogs (5-2, 4-0, 2-0 N) scored twice to pull out a 38-37 win over **Virginia State** in an epic battle of CIAA North Division contenders at BSU's homecoming.

BSU first scored on a 24-yard **Robert Chesson** run with 3:55 left in the third quarter to pull within 37-32. Then QB **Amir Hall** ran in from 2 yards out following an 8-play, 69-yard drive with 9:46 to play to take the lead. Both PATs were no good. After the score, VSU drove to the BSU 12 but **M. Hillequest's** 28-yard field goal for the lead was wide right.

Hall passed for 332 yards (25-36-0) and four TDs, two to WR **Nyme Manns** (9 rec., 129 yards) covering 16 and 18 yards. Hall also ran for a TD. **Brandon Britton** had five receptions for 96 yards including a 60-yard score.

VSU was led by RB **Trenton Cannon's** 138 yards on 19 carries including a scoring run of 76 yards. RB **Kavon Bellamy** added 104 rushing yards on 19 carries and scoring runs of 2 and 24 yards. QB **Tarian Ayres** (18-31-1) threw for two scores covering 30 yards to Cannon and 11 yards to **C. Harden**.

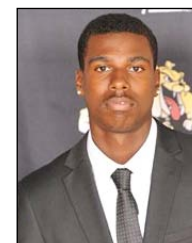
BCSP NO. 5 TENNESSEE STATE - The Tigers (5-2, 2-1 OVC) celebrated homecoming by jumping to a 35-3 halftime lead but were shut out in the second half and had to hold on to down Eastern Kentucky, 35-28.

Linebacker **Chris Collins** picked off an EKU aerial with :10 seconds left with the Colonels deep in TSU territory to preserve the win. Placekicker **Lane Clark** had missed a field goal in the final two minutes that could have put the game away.

QB **Ronald Butler** ran for 81 yards and scored on touchdown runs of 20 and 63 yards in the first half. TSU also scored on a 93-yard pass interception by **Ezra Robinson**, an 8-yard run by **Sabree Curtis Jr.**, a 3-yard run by **Andre Knox** and a 25-yard field goal.

• **KENTUCKY STATE** - The Thorobreds thrust themselves into the midst of the **SIAC** West race as they knocked off defending league champion **Miles** 28-24 in a key homecoming win for new head coach **John. L. Williams**

KSU scored on a 9-yard pass to **Charles Johnson** from QB **Jules St. Ge** with :31 seconds left in the half to lead 7-0 at the break. The lead grew to 14-0 on **Reginal Harris's** 13-yard run early in the third quarter. Miles came back to score twice on an 11-yard **Christian Mays** run and a 7-yard run from RB **Jamarcus Nance** to tie the score at 14 late in the third quarter.

KSU (3-4, 2-2, 2-0 W), who got 117 rushing yards from St. Ge, then scored on a **Demontre Warr** 3-yard run and a recovery of a fumble by Nance recovered in the end zone to go up 28-14. **Ger-Ke Jackson's** 63-yard TD run brought Miles within 28-21 and a Christiansen field goal brought them within 28-24.

- **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** - WSSU RB **Te'Vaughn Hurse** ran for 114 yards including a 63-yard TD run and fellow RB **Kerrion Moore** scored on two short runs as the Rams (5-2, 4-0, 2-0 S) rolled to a 45-10 homecoming win over **Sain Augustine's**.

QB **Rod Tinsley** added 186 passing yards (10-19-0) and two TDs in the win.

• BCSP No. 6 **SOUTHERN** - **Southern's** Jaguars and **Jackson State's** Tigers exchanged scores over the course of the game until Southern QB **Austin Howard** hit **Randall Menard** with 4:26 left on a 6-yard scoring pass and JSU could not answer enabling the Jags to escape with a 28-24 win.

Howard threw (24-35-1) for 288 yards and two scores and **Lenard Tillery** ran for 127 yards in 29 carries and the other two TDs.

• **ALABAMA STATE** - The Hornets (2-5, 2-4 E) ran for 346 yards and six TDs as they routed **Mississippi Valley State**, 56-24.

Khalid Thomas ran for 150 yards and one TD but five other running backs scored TDs in the rout.

• **ALABAMA A&M** - The Bulldogs (2-5, 2-4 E) got three rushing touchdowns and one touchdown pass from QB **De'Angelo Ballard** in a 40-7 thrashing of **Arkansas-Pine Bluff**. Ballard (17-27-0) also passed for 214 yards.

• BCSP No. 10 Virginia Union

• BCSP No. 10 **VIRGINIA UNION** - **Chowan** jumped on **Virginia Union** early and got four turnovers to hand the Panthers (4-3, 3-1, 2-1 N) their first **CIAA** loss in a 54-21 thrashing. QB **Randall Dixon** threw for 412 yards and two scores and RB **Tyree Lee** ran 25 times for 154 yards and four TDs and had a scoring catch in the win.

Lee opened by scoring on 2-yard run and then added an 8-yard pass TD from Dixon. He ran in from 14-yards out after the Hawks (5-2, 3-1 1-1 N) recovered a **Jusse York** fumble early in the second quarter to put them up 21-0. Chowan took a 27-0 lead when WR **Tyrone Carter** hit **Ryan Nolan** with a 39-yard flea flicker with 4:41 left in the half. The score followed a fumble by VUU WR **Kelly Lavatiae** on the first play after the kickoff.

VUU scored on a 1-yard **William Stanback** run to get on the board, trailing 27-7 but Chowan came right back to score on a 5-play drive covering 79 yards on Lee's 5-yard TD run. VUU closed on the first half scoring on a **5-yard pass from QB Shawheem Dowdy** to York to cut the lead to 27-14.

VUU took the second half kickoff and drove into Chowan territory before turning the ball over on downs. On their next possession, Dowdy was picked off by **A. Matthews** who returned the ball 24 yards to paydirt to put Chowan up 40-14. The Hawks did not let up scoring on 1-yard Lee run and a 7-yard pass from Dixon to **T. Baker** around a 9-yard Dowdy to Stanback score.

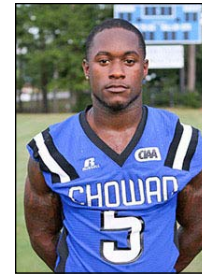

WORTH NOTING

– **MO' RECORDS** - At the rate North Carolina A&T RB **Tarik Cohen** is going, nothing is out of the question.

The dynamic 5-6, 173-pound runner posted his third straight 200-yard game, running for 220 yards on 25 carries to spur the Aggies to a 52-35 win over **Bethune-Cookman**.

Cohen, who became the MEAC's all-time leading rusher last week, is now less than 100 yards away from becoming the MEAC's first 5,000-yard career rusher.

White that mark is all but his, one question that now remains is how close can Cohen come to the 6,286 yards of black college all-time leader **Richard Huntley** of **Winston-Salem State**. With five regular season games and perhaps one bowl game left, Cohen is now less than 1,300 yards from that mark.

He would have to average over 200 yards per game – usually thought impossible until his recent three-game output. What's almost certain, barring injury, is that he will finish in second place

Averion is completing 49.4% of his passes for 1,184 yards, 9 TDs and four interceptions. Jalen is completing 63.8% of his passes for 1,385 yards, 9 TDs and 3 ints.

Both were coached in high school by their father, Averion Hurts, head coach at Channelview HS in Texas.
