• **HAMPTON** - The Pirates and head coach **Connell Maynor** had perhaps this week's biggest win as they knocked **South Carolina State** from the MEAC unbeaten ranks with a 28-26 home win.

Hampton quarterback **Jaylan Williamson** (16-27-1, 271 yards) threw three touchdown passes, two in the second half to wideouts **Rashawn Proctor** (4 yards, third quarter) and **Twarm Mixson** (57 yards, fourth quarter). Those scores allowed Hampton (4-4, 4-2 MEAC) to take 21-20 and 28-20 leads after trailing 20-14 at the half. The Mixson score came three plays after Hampton's **Robert Scott** forced a fumble by SCSU QB **Adrian Kollick Jr.** that was recovered by Hampton's **Brendan Cole** at the Hampton 35. Mixson (6 rec., 130 yds.) and Proctor (7 rec., 124 yds.) both topped the 100-yard mark.

SCSU (3-4, 3-1) scored with 2:30 left in the game on a 1-yard **Dondre Brown** run to pull within 28-26 but QB **Adrian Kollock** was stopped on the 2-point attempt that would have tied the game. Hampton recovered the ensuing on-side kick and was able to consume the last 2:23 on the clock.

Hampton scored on the game's first possession covering 68 yards in five plays and scoring on **Eric Carter's** 5-yard run. Kollock (11-18-0, 110 yards) started at quarterback for SC State and alternated with **Caleb York** (8-11-1, 106 yards) throughout the game. SCSU tied the game at 7 with just over four minutes left in the opening quarter on **Bishop Ford's** 1-yard run that capped a 9-play, 43-yard drive. Williamson then drove the Panthers 81-yards in six plays capped by his 12-yard scoring strike to **Jack Willenbrock** that put the Pirates up 14-7.

SCSU tied the score at 14 on its ensuing possession early in the second quarter on York's 23-yard scoring pass to **Kanome McIntosh**. SCSU went up 20-14 on York's 12-yard pass to Ford that finished off a 4-play, 54-yard drive just before the half. The big play in that drive was a 41-yard pass from York to **De'Montrez Burroughs**.

• **ELIZABETH CITY STATE** - The Vikings and first-year head coach **Earnest Wilson** kept themselves in the thick of the CIAA North Division race with one week left in the regular season as they pulled out a 24-21 home comeback win over **Virginia Union**.

ECSU (5-4, 4-2 N) trailed 14-9 at the half and went down 21-9 late in the third quarter after VUU's **Lavataie Kelly** returned a punt 86 yards to paydirt. But ECSU's **Davion Council** returned the ensuing kickoff 53 yards to the VUU 44 and six plays later **Byrum Chase** scored to pull ECSU within 21-16 with 3:21 left in the period.

On the Vikes' first fourth-quarter possession, QB **Daquan Neal** drove them 76 yards in 13 plays capped by his 4-yard scoring run. Neal (18-35-2, 197 yards, 21 carries, 85 yards) then ran in on a 2-point conversion attempt to put ECSU up 24-21 with 8:28 to play. After forcing a VUU punt, ECSU held the ball for the final 5:08 to salt away the win.

At 4-2 in CIAA North Division play, ECSU is tied with **Virginia Union** and **Virginia State**, one game behind **Bowie State** who is at 5-1. ECSU closes the regular season Saturday at Bowie State while Virginia State is at Virginia Union.

• **BCSP NO. 2 GRAMBLING STATE** - The G-Men (5-1, 5-0 SWAC W) have now defeated their last two opponents by a score of 129-10 after their 70-0 pasting of **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** Saturday.

Grambling rushed for 286 yards and rode 457 passing yards and six TDs from QB **Devante Kincade** (23-26-0) to the win. Wideout **Chad Williams** grabbed eight passes for 236 yards including touchdown catches of 70, 25 and 56 yards. Kincade's other scoring passes covered 5, 37 and 71 yards.

Lydemian Brook led the GSU ground attack with 120 yards on 15 carries while **Charles Wright** added two 18-yard fourth-quarter TD runs.

UAPB (1-6, 1-4 W) was held to 171 total yards, only six yards on 27 rushing attempts. GSU had six sacks for -40 yards and picked off two passes.



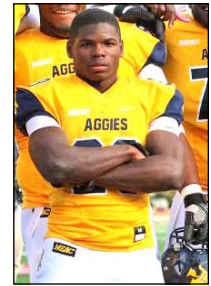

BCSP NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA A&T - The Aggies (7-1, 5-0 MEAC) broke open a relatively close game with 21 straight second-half points to pull away from **Florida A&M** and post a 42-17 win before a homecoming crowd of 22,150 fans.

MEAC career rushing leader **Tarik Cohen** added significantly to his total, carrying 17 times for 145 yards in the win. Cohen had scoring runs of 7 and 19 yards to help stake the Aggies to a 21-10 halftime lead before breaking loose for an 83-yard third-quarter scoring jaunt that all but sealed it and sent the partisan crowd heading for the exits to enjoy the rest of the homecoming activities.

Freshman wideout **Elijah Bell** hauled in a 25-yard scoring toss from QB **Lamar Raynard** (20-27-2, 230 yards) for the Aggies final first half score 1:12 before the break. **Marquell Cartwright** scored on a 1-yard run in the third quarter to put the Aggies up 28-10 before Cohen's 83-yarder.

Cohen moved into second place all time in HBCU rushing stats now with 5,199 yards trailing only the 6,286 yards by **Richard Huntley** of **Winston-Salem State**. Cohen now has 1,168 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns this season with three regular season games left.

• **ALBANY STATE and FORT VALLEY STATE** - **Albany State** defeated **Benedict** 34-7 Saturday and **Fort Valley State** beat **Morehouse** 24-16 setting up their *Fountain City Classic* match up next week in Columbus, Ga. to determine the **SIAC** East Division winner.

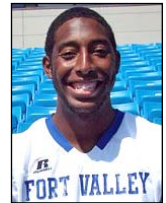
ASU (5-3, 4-1, 3-0 E) got 194 passing yards and three touchdowns from QB **Caleb Edmonds** (21-29-0) in downing Benedict. Edmonds also ran for 48 yards and two scores.

FVSU (3-6, 3-4, 3-0) got 166 passing yards and two scores from QB **Otis Brown** (12-23-0) who also added a TD run in its win over Morehouse.

The FSC winner will face West Division champ **Kentucky State** on Nov. 12 at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Alabama in the **SIAC** Championship Game.

- **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** - The Rams moved to 6-0 in **CIAA** play and clinched the South Division title and Nov. 12 championship game berth with a 30-23 come-from behind win at **Shaw's** homecoming Saturday. The Rams had to come back from a 16-7 halftime deficit to pull out the win.

WSSU pulled to within 16-7 just before the first half ended on QB **Rod Tinsley's** 29-yard scoring pass to **Demeeko Jones**.

Te Vaughn Hurse's 9-yard run in WSSU's first second-half possession got the Rams to within 16-14. On its next possession, they took the lead at 17-16 on **Will Johnson's** 30-yard field goal. Next time with the ball Tinsley hit **Michael Benis** on a 9-yard scoring toss to put WSSU up 24-16.

On its first fourth-quarter possession, WSSU went up 30-16 on **Justus Pickett's** 10-yard run.

Shaw (1-8, 1-5, 1-3) scored first on a 4-yard **Darren Dowling** run following Tinsley's fumble at the WSSU 4. The Bears added a field goal and blocked a WSSU field goal attempt before Dowling went in again from 8 yards to put them up 16-0.

WSSU's 6-0 conference mark (6-2 overall, 4-0 **CIAA** S) gives it a two-game lead over **Fayetteville State** who is also 4-0 in the South Division but 4-2 in the **CIAA**. The conference record determines the division winner.

- **ALABAMA A&M** - The largest crowd of the season so far, 63,110 at Birmingham's *Magic City Classic* at Legion Field, watched **Alabama A&M** pull out a 42-41 win in overtime as the Bulldogs converted a touchdown and **Nick Carden's** extra point attempt after **Alabama State** failed on its PAT attempt after scoring a TD in the first OT possession.

Davion Brantley scored on a 14-yard run in ASU's OT possession but **David Albert's** PAT attempt was no good. **Jonathan Dorsey** scored on a 18-yard pass from A&M QB **DeAngelo Ballard** when A&M got the ball. Carden's PAT gave the Bulldogs the winning point.

The teams entered the extra period tied at 35 after a see-saw contest. Alabama State led early 7-0 and 14-3 before A&M pulled within 14-13 by halftime and built a 27-14 lead midway thru the third

period.

Alabama State (2-6, 2-5 E) then scored three straight third-quarter touchdowns, the last coming with :11 seconds left in the third to go up 35-27. A&M tied it at 35 with 8:16 to play on **Tevin McKenzie's** 1-yard run and a two-point conversion pass from Ballard to **Kalias Robertson**. In the game's final minutes, A&M drove 88 yards to the ASU 16 but Carden's 33-yard field goal attempt with 1:12 left was blocked.

Ballard completed 19 of 35 passes for 290 yards and two TDs and ran 19 times for 101 yards. ASU got 170 rushing yards (24 carries) and one TD from **Khalid Thomas** and 127 rushing yards and one TD on six carries from QB **Quintrius Toppings**. Toppings also threw one TD pass. Bentley (15 carries, 82 yards) for AA&M and Brantley (six carries, 44 yards) for ASU each had two rushing touchdowns.

- TILLERY SETS SWAC CAREER RUSHING RECORD

- **Southern** senior RB **Lenard Tillery** ran for 195 yards in the Jaguars' 41-33 win over **Alcorn State** propelling him past former **Jackson State** RB **Destry Wright's** SWAC career record of 4,050 yards.

Tillery entered the season needing 859 yards to pass Wright's record and now has 960 yards this season, 4,132 yards for his career. The Jags have four regular season games left.

Tillery led the SWAC last season with 1,211 yards in 11 games. In 2014, he amassed 1,196 yards to finish third in SWAC rushing. In his freshman season, Tillery ran for 784 yards.

- **COHEN MOVES UP HBCU RUSHING LIST** - Meanwhile, **North Carolina A&T** RB **Tarik Cohen**, who has already become the **MEAC's** career rushing leader, moved to second on the all-time HBCU rushing list with his 145-yard performance Saturday vs. **Florida A&M**.

Cohen, the first 5,000-yard rusher in MEAC history, raised his career total to 5,199 yards to move into second place all-time behind **Richard Huntley** of **Winston-Salem State's** 6,286 yards. Cohen now has 1,168 rushing yards this season, his fourth straight 1,000-yard season. With three regular season games left, Cohen needs 555 yards (185.0 ypg.) to break **Delaware State** RB **Gene Lake's** single-season MEAC record of 1,722 rushing yards.
