After a total of 11 games were cancelled last week because of Hurricane Florence, all the teams are back on the field this week.

After three impressive non-conference wins, BCSP No. 1 **North Carolina A&T** (3-0), who was idle last week but is up to No. 4 nationally in both the FCS Coaches and FCS STATS polls, has its first date with a **Mid Eastern Athletic Conference** opponent this week as the Aggies entertain 0-3 **Morgan State** (6 p.m.).

Though the game is between MEAC foes, the A&T/MSU game is one of the designated games that will not count on the 2018 conference record. Each MEAC school is playing only seven conference games that will count on the conference ledger because of Hampton's late decision to pull out of the league.

Alcorn State (2-1) is up to second in the BCSP ranking after its win Saturday vs. **Texas Southern**. The Braves are on the road this week travelling to Itta Bena, Ms. to take on 0-2 **Mississippi Valley State** (6 p.m.).

No. 3 **Prairie View A&M** (1-3) is on the road for the fifth straight week as the Panthers open SWAC play at 1-2 **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** (6 p.m.).

losses to FBS programs, travels to Indianapolis Saturday (4:30 p.m.) for a key MEAC clash with BCSP No. 8 **Bethune-Cookman** (1-2) at the 35th *Circle City Classic* at Lucas Oil Stadium.

The Howard/B-CU match up last year in Washington, D.C. went down to the final minute with the Bison coming away with a 26-24 win. Howard and B-CU finished tied for second behind champion NC A&T in last year's MEAC race and are thought to be the top challengers, along with **North Carolina Central**, to the Aggies this season.

BCSP No. 4 **Grambling State** (0-2) along with MVSU are the only winless teams in the SWAC. Head coach **Broderick Fobbs** hopes to get the G-Men in the win column as they host 1-2 **Alabama State** Saturday (6 p.m.).

Undefeated BCSP No. 6 **Tennessee State** (1-0), who has had its last two games cancelled for inclement weather, opens Ohio Valley Conference play Saturday when it travels (2 p.m.) to Eastern Illinois (0-2).

North Carolina Central (1-1) is at No. 7 in the BCSP ranking and travels cross town in Durham, NC (3:30 p.m.) to face undefeated FBS and ACC member Duke (3-0).

No. 9 **Southern** and No. 10 **Bowie State** are playing inter-divisional games in their respective conferences.

The Southern Jags (1-2), out of the SWAC West Division, are facing Alabama A&M (1-2) out of the East in Mobile, Alabama in a classic dubbed the *Gulf Coast Challenge* (4 p.m.).

Bowie State (2-1) is in one of five CIAA North/South Division contests being played on the home fields of the South Division teams.
