## BIG WINNERS!

As we come down the stretch of the 2018 season, the teams still alive for conference championships are lining up.

• In the SIAC, **ALBANY STATE** took another step towards the East Division title and berth in the Nov. 10 championship game vs. the West Division champion with a 36-3 pasting of **Clark Atlanta**. The Golden Rams (5-3, 4-0 SIAC E), who knocked **Morehouse** from the undefeated ranks last week 41-19, completed the sweep of the Atlanta teams and East Division foes. ASU leads the East by a half-game.

Behind a safety, a blocked field goal return for a TD, two **Gabriel Ballinas** field goals (40 and 48 yards) and a 3-yard TD run by **Kelias Williams**, ASU built a 22-0 halftime lead and was never headed.

CAU (2-5, 1-4, 1-2) outgained ASU 304 yards to 215 yards but lost two fumbles and was picked off twice. The Panthers only scored on a third-quarter field goal.

• **MOREHOUSE** used special teams scores and a stingy defense to bounce back from its loss to Albany State last week by going into **Benedict's** homecoming and knocking off the Tigers 14-10.

The Maroon **Tigers** (7-1, 3-1 SIAC E) scored on the first possession of the game as **Ben Goins** picked up a bad snap on a Benedict punt and ran 10 yards to paydirt. After Benedict (5-2, 3-1) tied the game at 7 on QB **Dominique Harris's** 11-yard TD pass to **Danye Washington**, Morehouse got another special teams score just before the half as sophomore **Bertram Johnson** blocked a punt and ran it in from five yards out to put his team up 14-7.

The only second half score was a 26-yard field goal by Benedict placekicker **Rigoberto Tinoco**. Neither team topped 200 yards of offense as Benedict was held to 192 yards and Morehouse managed only 148 yards. The teams combined to go 5 of 27 on third downs.

Albany State travels to Benedict Saturday for a key game in the division.

• In the West, **TUSKEGEE** moved closer to a division title with a 37-0 homecoming shutout of **Kentucky State**. Tuskegee has a half-game lead over **Miles** (2-6, 2-2 W).

The Golden **Tigers** (5-3, 3-1 SIAC W) got four TD passes from QB **Ahmad Deramus**, three in the first half as they built a 28-0 lead. Deramus finished 12 of 18 for 235 yards as he hit **Javarious Cheatham**, **Peyton Ranzy**, **Chardian Johnson** and **Justice Owens** with scoring tosses.

• In the CIAA, **Bowie State** re-established itself atop the Northern Division race as it went on the road and knocked off **Virginia Union**, 27-13.

BSU (5-2, 3-1 N) now has wins over both VUU and VSU in head-to-head competition, teams that are also 1-1 in games that count towards the division championship.

Against VUU, BSU got two TD passes on 33-of-49 passing from QB **Amir Hall**. His passes covered 370 yards. Running back **Maurice Williams** hauled in a 40-yard pass from Hall for a score in the final quarter. Fellow RB **Brandon Abrams** caught a 56-yard pass from Hall for a score in the first quarter and later scored on a 9-yard TD run in the fourth quarter that sealed the win.

BSU placekicker **Gene Carson** had field goals of 23 and 17 yards.

VSU's only touchdown came on a 6-yard run by QB **Darius Taylor** in the third quarter. **Jefferson Souza** had field goals of 39 and 43 yards for the other Panther points. The 43-yarder with nine minutes left cut the BSU lead to 20-13. Abrams' 9-yard scoring run came at the end of a 14-play, 89-yard drive.

• In the South, **FAYETTEVILLE STATE** used a trio of big plays to hold off **St. Augustine's** 31-28 and maintain its half-game lead in the division.

The **Broncos** (5-1, 4-0 S) scored on a 95-yard kickoff return by **Brandon Smith** late in the first quarter, a 50-yard fumble return by **Sha'Mon Squires** early in the second quarter and a 64-yard pass from QB **Collyn Anderson** to **Bruce Davis** early in the fourth quarter.

SAU fought back from a 2-7 early second quarter deficit to pull within 24-21 by halftime. But the Falcons (2-5, 2-2 S) could only muster a fourth-quarter TD pass from QB **John Darby IV** to **Lenwood Joyner** in the second half.

• **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** stayed a half-game behind FSU as they got a 34-19 homecoming win over **Livingstone**.

The Rams (4-3, 3-1 S) got 54- and 52-yard TDs from RB **Kerrian Moore** (21 carries, 154 yards) in the second quarter to break open a close game. WSSU also scored on a blocked punt return, a blocked PAT return, on QB **Dominique Graves'** 27-yard run and two **Riley Robbins** field goals (23 and 27 yards).

• BCSP No. 2 **ALCORN STATE** and No. 3 **SOUTHERN** maintained their leads atop the SWAC division races.

In the East, Alcorn State scored on a 1-yard pass from QB **Noah Johnson** to **Chris Blair** with just 1:2 seconds left to down **Grambling State**, 33-26 in a see-saw battle between teams that have faced each other in the last three league title games.

The deciding touchdown came after Grambling punted from its own 8-yard line and gave the ball back to Alcorn State at the Grambling 41 with 1:42 to play. The Braves (6-2, 4-1 E) needed six plays to cover the distance. A key play in the game-winning drive was a 33-yard pass from Johnson to **Dayell Harris** that carried to the Grambling 3.

Alcorn had scored 23 unanswered points to fight back from an early 13-0 first quarter deficit and lead 23-13 at the break. The Braves scored on a 12-yard run by RB **DeShawn Waller**, a 26-yard field goal by **Charles McCullough**, a 9-yard scoring toss from Johnson to Blair and a 34-yard return of an intercept by **Javen Morrison**.

A 24-yard scoring run from QB **Gerard Hickbottom** sandwiched around 52- and 40-yard field goals by **Mark Orozco**, the last with 12:03 to play allowed Grambling to pull into a 23-all tie. Grambling went up 26-23 on Orozco's 46-yarder with 6:41 left in the final period.

• BCSP No. 3 **SOUTHERN** stayed atop the SWAC West Division with a 21-7 win over **Texas Southern** in a game played before a crowd of 17,105 at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas. The game was dubbed the *State Fair Showdown*.

The **Jaguars** (4-3, 3-1 W) ran out to a 21-0 lead vs. TSU, 14-0 at the half. They got a blocked punt by **Jordan Lewis** and a 17-yard return for a TD by **Carlos Stephens** after TSU's possession that opened the game. Later in the period, QB **Ladarius Skelton** scored on a 4-yard run off a drive that covered 57 yards in 9 plays.

In the third quarter, **John Lampley** replaced Skelton after he was injured and hit **Trey Smith** with a 17-yard TD pass.

The Southern defense was strong, allowing TSU to convert just three of 15 third-down attempts and one of four fourth downs. Lewis and **Tyran Nash** both had two sacks to lead the Southern defensive effort.

• **MEAC** leader **Florida A&M** (5-2, 4-0 MEAC) had a bye week, but close pursuers **NORTH CAROLINA A&T** (6-2, 3-1), **HOWARD** (3-3, 3-1) and **NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** (3-3, 2-1) will go to a 1-1 game behind the Rattlers. FAMU already has wins over A&T and NCCU.

• BCSP No. 5 A&T got 118 yards (10 carries) including a 67-yard TD scamper from **Jah-Maine Martin**, two TD passes from QB **Lamar Raynard** and one from back-up **Kyll Icar** in a 35-10 win over **Bethune-Cookman**.

• Running back **Dedrick Parsons** of BCSP No. 7 **HOWARD** scored on touchdown runs of 31 and 26 yards in the second-half of the fourth period to allow the Bison to pull away from **Morgan State**, 35-26.

Parsons finished with 148 yards on 16 carries to take up the slack from QB **Caylin Newton** who struggled, completing just 14 of 32 passes and throwing two picks without a TD. Newton did run for a first quarter 1-yard TD.

MSU took a 26-20 lead into the fourth quarter before Parsons' heroics. His first score came after a 24-yard punt gave Howard the ball at the Morgan 31. Parsons scored on the first play after the punt. The last score was after MSU turned the ball over on downs at its own 31 with 1:15 to play.

• **NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL** spoiled homecoming for **Norfolk State**, downing the Spartans 36-6. The Eagles used a combination of big plays and turnovers to build a 36-0 lead only allowing an NSU touchdown in the final half-minute.

The big plays included a 93-yard scoring pass from QB **Chauncey Caldwell** to **Sherman McLeod** and a 35-yard TD run from **Isaiah Totten** (12 carries, 108 yards). Caldwell scored on a 5-yard TD run in the second quarter following a blocked punt. RB **Tyquan Watson** scored on a 5-yard run following a sack and fumble in the fourth quarter.

## OFF THE SCHNEID!

- Previously winless **MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE** got 174 rushing yards and three TDs from QB **Dejerrie Bryant**, the final score coming on his 10-yard run in the second overtime to allow the Delta Devils to pull out a 48-47 win over one-win **Arkansas-Pine Bluff**.

Bryant had swaced on a 43-yard run with 1:31 left in regulation to give MVSU a 34-27 lead. But UAPB (1-6, 0-3 SWAC W) drove 75 yards in nine plays and scored on a 7-yard pass from QB **Perry Skyles** to **Dejuan Miller** with no time on the clock to force overtime with the teams tied at 34.

Both teams scored TDs and PATs in the first overtime. After reaching paydirt in the second overtime on a 1-yard run by RB **Yatzer Porter**, UABP placekicker **Jamie Gillan** missed the PAT. After Bryant's 10-yard run, MVSU placekicker **Ruben Piraquiver** kicked through the game-winning point.

Perry finished with 257 passing yards (18-of-33) and three touchdowns. Porter rushed for 173 yards on 37 carries. Bryant also had rushing TDs of 1 and 3 yards and was 11 of 19 passing for 117 yards. MVSU WR **Booker Chambers** ran for 127 yards (7 carries) and TD runs of 65 and 25 yards and had 21 receiving yards.

• **CIAA DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP CRITERIA:** Division champions in 2018 in the CIAA will be determined by a six-game conference schedule the conference announced last week. The change from a seven-game schedule to a six-game schedule is only for this year because of the inclement weather that caused the cancellation of several games.

The six games used to determine the division champions and participants in the Nov. 10 Championships Game in Salem, Va., will be the five intra-divisional games and one cross-divisional game, particularly the last of such games before the teams began their five-game division schedule.

In case of a tie between divisional teams, the winner shall be determined as follows:

- Head-to-Head Competition
- Head-to-Head Point Differential
- Divisional Winning Percentage
- Results vs. Common Conference Opponents
- Coin Toss

• **HALL GETS THE CIAA CAREER RECORD FOR TD PASSES:** Senior **Maurice Williams** (Baltimore, Md.) scored on a 40-yard touchdown pass from QB **Amir Hall** to give **Bowie State** a 20-10 advantage with 11:57 to go in its game vs. **Virginia Union** Saturday.

With the TD pass, Hall now has 90 TD passes for his career and became the CIAA's All-Time leader in TD passes surpassing **Earl "Air" Harvey's** (N.C. Central / 1985-1988) record of 89.

Hall now has 9,892 career passing yards, leaving him 728 yards from tying Harvey's CIAA career passing yards record. Hall has two games left in the regular season.
