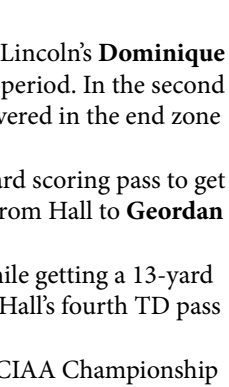

UPSET SATURDAY: Could easily be the name for games this weekend as a lot of favored teams - North Carolina Central, Tuskegee, Winston-Salem State and Norfolk State - bit the dust.

In the CIAA, a 45-7 win by Fayetteville State over Livingstone and loss by Winston-Salem State, 26-21 at Shaw's homecoming...

Livingstone lost two fumbles and threw two interceptions. QB Amir Hall and Bowie State overcame an early pick six and a 14-0 first-quarter hole in downing Lincoln (Pa.), 35-14 to move closer to the North Division title...

Hall, who finished 24 of 42 for 306 yards and four TDs, was picked off by Lincoln's Dominique Rogers who returned it 50 yards to paydirt for a 7-0 LU lead midway thru the first period.

On the second play after the kickoff, Hall hit WR Montez Clay on a 68-yard scoring pass to get the Bulldogs on the board. They added a safety and another scoring toss, this one from Hall to Geordan Clark to send BSU into halftime up 15-14.

The Bulldogs restored order in the second half, shutting out the Tigers while getting a 13-yard TD run from RB Maurice Williams and a 9-yard scoring pass from Hall to Clark. Hall's fourth TD pass came in the fourth quarter as he hit Lansana Sesay from 33 yards out.

BSU can take the North Division title and punch its ticket to the Nov. 10 CIAA Championship Game with a win next week at home vs. one-win Elizabeth City State.

BCSP No. 10 ALBANY STATE won its sixth straight game, going on the road to post a 21-0 shutout of Benedict to claim the SIAC East Division title and a berth in the Nov. 10 conference title game.

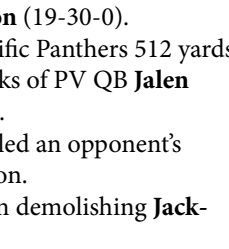
The Golden Rams (6-3, 5-0 SIAC E) limited the Tigers (5-2, 3-2 E) to 169 yards and kept them out of the end zone. On offense, QB Kelias Williams threw for two TDs and ran for one...

The final score came late in the second quarter when Williams (8 of 13, 120 yards, 2 TDs - 15 carries, 87 yards, 1 TD) scampered 53 yards from hitting WR Mike Green on a 10-yard strike.

The Marauders (4-5, 3-3 West) got 376 passing yards and three TDs thru the air and one on the ground from QB Trent Mays (19-39-1) in the win.

Tuskegee (5-4, 3-2 W) countered with three scoring passes from QB Ahmad Deramus (17-37-0, 300 yards) and two rushing TDs from RB Justice Owens.

Javarius Cheatham led the TU receivers with seven receptions for 122 yards including a 13-yard scoring reception with 8:59 to play that got the Golden Tigers up 36-33 with 8:59 left. Saffold hauled in his game-winner on the second play after the ensuing kickoff.



CENTRAL STATE RB Trent Mays

In the SWAC, BCSP No. 2 ALBANY STATE passed its test against Prairie View, downing the Panthers 27-13 behind 120 rushing yards and a TD from RB Deshawn Waller and 263 passing yards and two TDs from QB Noah Johnson (19-30-0).

The Braves (7-2, 5-1 SWAC E) outgained the once-prolific Panthers 512 yards to 235 while picking them off twice and registering five sacks of PV QB Jalen Morton. The only PV touchdown came on a kickoff return.

It was the third time this season the Panthers have spoiled an opponent's homecoming and gives them a one-game lead in the division. BCSP No. 3 SOUTHERN scored in all three phases in demolishing Jacksonville State, 41-7.

QB Ladarius Skelton scored on a 15-yard run and hit Trey Smith with a 27-yard TD pass, both in the first quarter to put Southern up 14-0.

The Jaguars (5-3, 4-1 SWAC) added two TDs on fumble returns, a 42-yarder in the second quarter and a 36-yarder that closed out the scoring late in the final period.

Shontega Thomas scored on a 92-yard kickoff return and placekicker Martell Fontenot connected on 31- and 42-yard field goals as the special teams got into the act.

ALABAMA A&M got 322 passing yards and three TDs from QB Aqeel Glass, 204 receiving yards and two TDs from wideout Nathaniel Dell in downing rival Alabama State before a season-high crowd of 65,906 at the 77th Magic City Classic at historic Legion Field in Birmingham, Ala.

Glass hit Dell with a 26-yarder to open the scoring early in the first quarter and then connected with Dell on an 81-yarder early in the fourth quarter. RB Jordan Bentley added a 57-yard TD run for the only third-quarter score.

Glass capped off his performance hitting Joseph Burke with a 9-yard scoring toss with 1:42 left in the game.

In the MEAC, first-place and BCSP No. 1 FLORIDA A&M had no problem getting a 38-3 home win over Morgan State but two of its pursuers in the conference race fell.

QB Ryan Stanley (14-22-0, 163 yards) threw for three TDs while RB Deshawn Smith ran for 116 yards and one score in the Rattlers' fifth straight win.

Meanwhile, Howard and North Carolina Central, who both had one conference loss entering play Saturday, fell to South Carolina State (27-21) and Delaware State (28-13) respectively.

FAMU (6-2, 5-0) led 31-0 at the half as Stanley connected with three different receivers - Chad Hunter from 22 yards, Marcus Williams from 15 yards and Xavier Smith from 21 yards. Smith's 36-yard TD run was the only score of the third quarter and staked FAMU to a 3-0 lead.

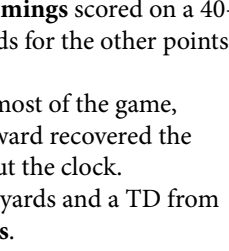
SOUTH CAROLINA STATE picked off Howard's MEAC passing and total offense leader sophomore QB Caylin Newton twice leading to a 27-7 lead before settling for a 27-21 win at the Bison's homecoming.

SCSU QB Tyrce Nick was clean in the passing game, connecting on 11 of 19 for 166 yards without a pick, and rushed for 69 yards and two TDs (14 and 1 yards). Omar Cummings scored on a 40-yard run and placekicker Dillon Bredson was good on field goals of 46 and 20 yards for the other points for the Bulldogs (3-5, 3-2 MEAC).

Howard (3-4, 3-2), who played without standout WR Jequez Ezzard for most of the game, scored two touchdowns late, the last with 1:53 to play, to cut the lead to 27-21. Howard recovered the ensuing onside kick but was ruled offside. SCSU recovered the re-kick and ran out the clock.

SAVANNAH STATE thrashed Norfolk State, 32-3 behind 118 rushing yards and a TD from Rashad Saxton and two passing scores (4 and 22 yards) from QB D'Vonn Gibbons.

Previously winless DELAWARE STATE used homecoming to get its first win of the season and first for new head coach Rod Milstead as the Hornets stunned North Carolina Central 28-13.

DSU QB Jack McDaniels threw two early TD passes and Michael Chris-Ike ran for 127 yards and a touchdown to pace the Hornets (1-7, 1-4 MEAC).

RB Bryceen Alleyne capped the scoring as he scampered 76 yards to paydirt with 4:42 to play. Alleyne also topped 100 yards in the ground game, getting 122 yards on 16 carries.

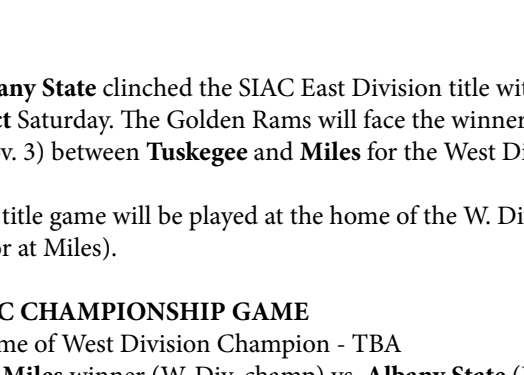
