BIG WINNERS!

TITLE GAME CLINCHERS:
Bowie State was expected to beat **Elizabeth City State** and punch its ticket to next week's **CIAA** Championship Game, and it did 49-7. But the same can't be said for **Miles** in the **SIAC** who upset **Tuskegee** 31-27 to take the West Division title and championship game berth.

• Quarterback **Amir Hall**, playing in his final regular season game, threw for 333 yards and four TDs as **BCSP** No. 7 **BOWIE STATE** easily got past **Elizabeth City State** 49-7 to take the **CIAA** North Division crown and a berth in next week's league title game in Salem, Va. vs. South Division champ **Fayetteville State**.

Hall completed 24 of 39 passes without an interception with all his touchdown passes coming in the first half as the Bulldogs (8-2, 5-1 CIAA N) built a 42-0 lead by halftime.

• **MILES** scored on a 27-yard touchdown pass from **Daniel Smith** to **Leonard Tyree** with 1:45 remaining, then forced four incomplete passes on the ensuing series - the last coming with 16 seconds left - to stage a come-from-behind win over **Tuskegee** 31-27 in front of a capacity Senior Day crowd of 8,500 at Sloan-Alumni Stadium.

The win gives Miles (4-6, 4-2 SIAC West) the **SIAC** Western Division title and a spot in the league championship game next week against East Division champ **Albany State**.

Behind two TD passes and a rushing touchdown from QB **Ahmad Deraimus**, Tuskegee (5-5, 3-3 W) built a 24-7 lead early in the third quarter. The Miles comeback began when Smith (17-35, 1, 241 yards) hit **Malik Campbell** with a 59-yard TD pass with 9:06 left in the third quarter.

On the second play after the kickoff, **Mitchell Smiley** picked up a fumble by TU running back **Kenny Gant** and returned it 21 yards to paydirt, cutting the TU lead to 24-21. It stayed that way until early in the fourth quarter when Miles PK **Jackson Spradlin** capped a 16-play, 62-yard drive with a 24-yard field goal that tied the game at 24 with 13:52 left.

TU forged ahead 27-24 when placekicker **Arnes Huskic** hit on a 37-yard field goal with 5:23 to play.

The Miles game-winning drive covered 70 yards in nine plays with Smith completing three passes for 46 yards and rushing for 9 yards before connecting with Leonard for the score.

RACES HEAT UP:
 While **SWAC** East Division leader **Alcorn State** dropped an out-of-conference game at New Mexico State (52-42), the Braves three closest pursuers in the SWAC East - **Jackson State, Alabama State** and **Alabama A&M** - got conference wins.

In the **MEAC**, **Howard** handed first-place **Florida A&M** its first conference loss, tightening up things as the season enters its final two weeks.

• In the **SIAC**, **JACKSON STATE**, playing its first game under interim head coach **John Hendrick**, continued **Prairie View's** downhill spiral with a stunning 34-28 win.

JSU (4-4, 3-2), who struggled on offense leading to the dismissal last week of head coach **Tony Hughes**, got 185 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns to go with 150 passing yards and a score from QB **Jarrad Hayes** (17-27-1) in the win.

JSU built a 24-0 first-half lead as Hayes hit **Romelo Shumake** with an 8-yard pass to open the scoring and added a 1-yard **Quitten Brown** TD run, an 18-yard field goal by **Christian Jacquemin** and a 59-yard **Jordan Johnson** scoring run. **Prairie View**, after replacing starting QB **Jalen Morton**, finally got on the board on a 6-yard pass from back-up **Trazon Connley** to **Markus Hardy** :06 seconds before halftime.

JSU increased its lead to 27-7 on a Jacquemin 20-yard field goal on the first second-half possession before PV (3-6, 2-3 W) answered with a 72-yard Connley TD run cutting the lead to 17-14.

JSU went up 34-14 on a 2-yard TD run by Brown early in the fourth quarter. PV scored twice in the fourth quarter on 21- and 11-yard passes from Connley to **Zarrian Holcomb**, the final one coming with 2:45 to play.

JSU recovered the ensuing onsides kick and was able to run out the clock.

• **ALABAMA A&M** amassed 618 yards of total offense, 359 passing yards and three TDs from QB **Aqeel Glass** and 259 rushing yards including 152 and a touchdown from RB **Trevon Walters** in a 45-14 rout of **Arkansas-Pine Bluff**.

The Bulldogs (5-4 4-2 SWAC E) led 14-0 at the half behind Glass's scoring passes to **Zabrial Moore** of 31 yards and 42 yards to **Nathaniel Dell**. They built the lead to 35-6 by the end of the third quarter after Glass (21-42-1) connected with **Octavius Miles** from 56 yards out as the quarter ended.

Walters had a 72-yard TD run early in the third quarter. **Dylan Smith** capped the A&M scoring with a 34-yard run late in the final period.

– **ALABAMA STATE** (3-5, 2-2 E), the only conference team with a win over Alcorn State, stayed even with Alabama A&M and Jackson State a half-game behind Alcorn State with a see-saw 30-21 win over **Texas Southern**.

ASU QB **Khadarris Davis** (16-25-2, 171 yards) ran 10 yards for a second-quarter touchdown and added two second-half TD passes, the last early in the fourth quarter allowing the Hornets to pull away from TSU (2-7, 1-4 W). Davis also led ASU with 104 rushing yards.

TSU RB **Brad Woodard** ran for two TDs (2 and 7 yards) and WR **TrenDavion Dixon** scored on a 90-yard TD pass from QB **Devin Williams** for TSU's points.

Williams (8-14-2, 227 yards) however threw two picks, both by **Joshua Hill**, the first returned 29 yards to paydirt to open the scoring.

• **BCSP** No. 9 **HOWARD** jumped out to a 21-10 lead early and held on to hand **BCSP** No. 1 **Florida A&M** its first conference loss, 31-23.

Sophomore QB **Caylin Newton** (15-30-2, 172 yards) threw two picks, but hit his favorite targets, WRs **Jequez Ezzard** and **Kyle Anthony**, with their first half touchdowns covering 22 and 12 yards as the Bison (4-4, 4-2) jumped on top early. He headed a 1-yard TD run that put the Bison up 28-17 late in the third quarter.

FAMU (6-3, 5-1) pulled within 28-23 on QB **Ryan Swanley's** 15-yard scoring pass to **Xavier Smith** early in the fourth quarter. **Howard** went up 31-23 on **Joseph Faraji's** 24-yard field goal with 8:25 left and then thwarted FAMU's attempt at a game-tying drive as **Jalen Smith** intercepted Swartley (23-41-2, 272 yards, 2 TDs) in the Howard end zone. FAMU had one final possession but could not muster a first down.

Sophomore RB **Dedrick Parsons** ran 26 times for 149 yards including an 11-yard TD run in the first period to lead the Bison's ground attack. Parsons has run for the past three games.

• **BCSP** No. 4 **NORTH CAROLINA A&T** had some shaky moments but used a punishing ground game to pull out a 37-20 homecoming win over **Norfolk State**, and with FAMU's loss to Howard, tie for the MEAC lead.

The Aggies surrendered a 69-yard punt return to **Marcus Taylor** after the first series of the game to fall behind early and only had a 21-20 lead after NSU placekicker **Josh Nardone** hit on a 25-yard field goal late in the third quarter. But **Malik Wilson** brought back the ensuing kickoff 99 yards to paydirt opening a run that saw the Aggies (7-2, 4-1) score the game's final 10 points.

Placekicker **Noel Ruiz** hit on a 42-yard field goal midway thru the fourth-quarter and RB **Marquell Cartwright** capped the scoring on an 8-yard run with 2:19 left.

Cartwright, who also scored on a 5-yard run in the second quarter, finished with a career-high 183 yards on 21 carries. **Jah-Maine Martin** added 130 rushing yards on 10 carries including an 8-yard first-quarter scoring run. The Aggies finished with 310 rushing yards.

• **BETHUNE-COOKMAN** used TD runs of 61, 60 and 65 yards from RB **Jimmie Robinson** to build a 23-8 lead midway thru the third quarter and then held on to down **Morgan State** 30-28 to remain in the MEAC race.

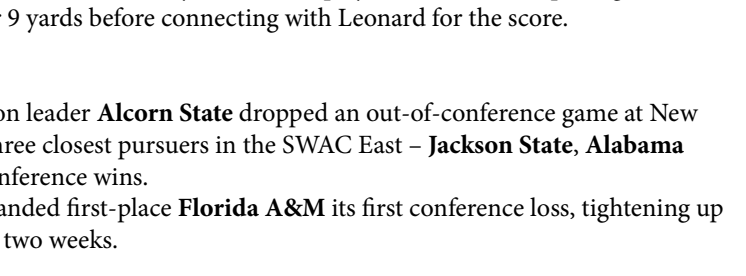
Robinson, who finished with 208 yards on 11 carries, scored once in each of the first three quarters as the Wildcats (5-5, 3-2 MEAC) built the lead. But MSU got a 2-yard scoring run from QB **D. J. Golatt Jr.** (19-39-1, 257 yards, 3 TDs) with 5:01 left in the third quarter and a Golatt to **Xavier Gravette** 15-yard scoring pass that pulled the Bears within 23-21 early in the final period.

B-CU RB **Tupac Isme's** 16-yard TD run put B-CU up 30-21 with 8:33 to play. MSU got the final score on a 21-yard pass from Golatt to **Daylen Baldwin** with 5:55 left.

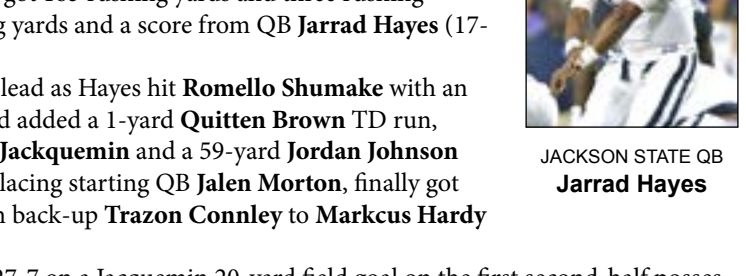
MSU got the ball back two more times but the drives ended in a punt and a Golatt interception.



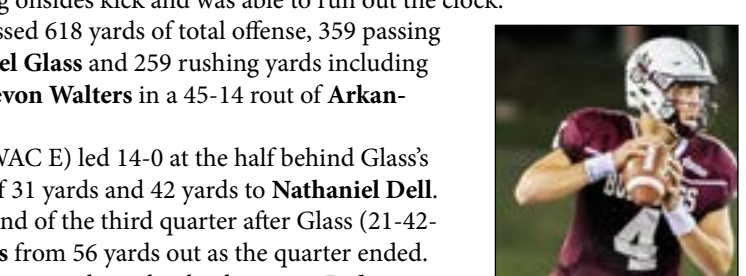
