### NEW FOOTBALL COACH, AD AT LANE:

Lane College President Logan Hampton has announced that Dragons Head Football Coach Derrick Burroughs will step into a full-time role as Athletics Director for the College, vacating the seat of head football coach.

The school also announced that Assistant Football Coach Vyron Brown will lead the football program as head football coach, effective January 15.

"I want to thank Coach Burroughs for his dedication to Lane's football," Dr. Hampton, said of Burroughs who has led the Dragons in two stints totalling seven years. "I know that many of our current players, their parents and alumni have close associations with Coach Burroughs. I am glad that he will continue to forge ahead with our athletic department."

Brown brings 16 years of coaching experience to the job and has worked at the secondary and collegiate levels as well as the National Football League.

He began his coaching career at Grambling State University after playing in the last recruiting class for legendary head coach Eddie Robinson. Under head coach Doug Williams he served as a graduate assistant and then later as running backs coach.

At Shaw University in 2008, Brown was the offensive coordinator for the CIAA champions. While at Lane, he has served as offensive coordinator, recruiting coordinator and Dragon Academy liaison.

### MILLER TAKES NEW POST AT NSU:

NORFOLK, Va. - Norfolk State University President Dr. Javanaugh Adams-Gaston announced last week that Marty Miller, NSU Director of Athletics, has agreed to accept a senior administrative position to assist her.

This new role will work closely with the President to provide support for the development and continued success of the University. The institution has hired a search firm to conduct a national search for NSU's next Director of Athletics. Miller will continue to serve as NSU Athletics Director until the role is permanently filled.

"I am honored that Dr. Adams-Gaston has selected me to serve in another significant role in her administration," said Miller, who has served as NSU's Athletics Director since December 2004. "I know that I will be confronted with some new challenges, but I will continue to give my best each and every day. This is an exciting and proud moment for me and my family."

**Roger Ray**, 5-10, Sr., G, LUV - Averaged 33.3 points, 6 assists, 4.5 rebounds and one steal in three games. Had 37 and 33 points in wins over St. Aug's and Shaw and 30 in loss to JCSU. Leads CIAA in scoring (22.8 ppg.)

**Lydell Elmore**, 6-9, Jr., F, LIV - Got 33 rebounds (11.0 rpg.) in three games including 27 on the defensive end. Had 24 pts., 16 rebs., vs. Shaw.

**Nigel Martin**, 6-5, Fr., G, SHAW - Averaged 26 points and 13.5 rebounds in two games. Had 27 and 12 vs. Livingstone, 25 and 15 vs. BSU. Leads freshmen at 15.8 ppg.

## LUT WILLIAMS

Coming up this week on one month (four weeks) before the CIAA Tournament (February 25-29 in Charlotte, NC) with the SIAC Tournament a week later (March 2-7 in Rock Hill, SC), here's how those races are looking.

The CIAA determines its regular season men's and women's standings and tournament seedings by conference records.

In the seven-member South Division, the seeding is determined by a 17-game schedule that includes 12 home-and-home games against teams in the division and five designated 'crossover' games against North Division teams.

In the five-member North, it's a 15-game slate that includes eight home-and-home games against N. Div. teams and seven designated 'crossover' games against teams from the South. 'Crossover' games that count on the conference record are identified with an asterisk on the teams' schedules at theciaa.com. Intra-division records are used as tie-breakers.

In the men's North, defending tournament champion Virginia State sits atop the standings at 6-1 followed by 4-2 Virginia Union and 4-3 Bowie State.

VUU, however, got a big 82-62 win over V-State Saturday in their annual MLK Day affair in Richmond as the league's No. 2 scorer, 6-foot senior guard Terrell Leach (22.0 ppg.), threw in 34 points including hitting on 7-of-13 3-pointers. Fellow guard Tyrek Bailey was 5-of-5 from behind the arc and finished with 22 points. VUU shot 14 of 26 (53.8%) from 3-point range in the win.

In the men's South, 6-2 Winston-Salem State is a half-game up on 5-3 Johnson C. Smith and Fayetteville State with 5-4 Livingstone another game back. JCSU won at Livingstone Saturday (77-72).

This Saturday, FSU is at WSSU and VUU is at JCSU in a 'crossover' game while VSU hosts Elizabeth City State.

Lincoln and Bowie State, both at 6-1, lead the women's North with VUU third at 5-1. Lincoln is coming off a thrashing (76-46) of nationally-ranked (5th) VUU last Wednesday.

FSU (6-2) is first and JCSU (5-3) is second in the women's South.

## SIAC

Albany State (8-2) posted two wins to move to the top of the men's East Division while Clark Atlanta (6-2) lost at home

to Savannah State. CAU is at 5-6 Morehouse Saturday and Albany State Monday.

Miles won at Tuskegee 67-65 on a last-second shot by guard Avery Brown Saturday to tie the Golden Tigers for the W. Div. lead at 7-2. Miles hosts Kentucky State Saturday while Tuskegee is at Lane. Miles hosts Central State Monday.

Benedict (7-1) is setting the pace in the women's East while Tuskegee and Miles are both 6-3 atop the W. Div.

## MEAC

Coppin State and Florida A&M made the biggest noise in the men's race as CSU handed N. C. A&T (4-1) its first conference loss, 79-75 Saturday in Baltimore, and FAMU won at home vs. N. C. Central, 66-57 Monday.

Norfolk State (4-0) stayed atop the standings with a 62-52 win over Maryland-Eastern Shore while South Carolina State (4-1) got two wins to tie A&T for second.

On the women's side, Morgan State had the shocker, handing NC A&T its first league loss, 42-38 Monday. The result leaves Norfolk State atop the standings at 4-0. B-CU is tied with A&T at 4-1.

## SWAC

Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M both got wins over Grambling State and Jackson State and lead the men's SWAC race at 4-1.

PV A&M hosts Arkansas-Pine Bluff and TSU hosts Miss. Valley State Saturday. They then trade opponents Monday.

Jackson State eaked out close home wins over PV A&M (53-49) and TSU (81-79 in OT) to move to the top of the women's standings at 6-0.

TSU is second at 4-1 with Alcorn State and Southern tied for third at 4-2.
