• RUNNING AWAY!! - Head coach **Charlie Jackson** and the **KENTUCKY STATE** Thorobreds are perhaps casting themselves as a force to be reckoned with in the **SIAC** as they notched a big win, knocking off **SWAC** member **Jackson State**, 33-25 at the **33rd Circle City Classic** in Indianapolis.

KSU (2-1) completed only one pass but ran the ball 48 times for 353 yards and three TDs in pulling out the victory.

That only completion went for 31 yards and a TD from QB **Jaylen Myers** (1-3-0, 31 passing yards, 13 car., 92 rushing yards, 1 TD) to wideout **Jonathan Powell** in the first quarter after JSU (1-3) had jumped out to a 10-0 lead. But it started a stretch that saw the Thorobreds score 33 unanswered points and lead 33-10 entering the final period.

In that stretch, KSU got rushing touchdown from Myers (4 yards) and **Jordan Level** (16 yards) in the second quarter to lead 20-10 at the break, and the scoring run from **Brett Syde** (8 yards) and a 32-yard fumble return for a TD by **Jacob Abrams** in the third period for the 33-10 lead.

JSU reached paydirt twice in the fourth quarter on passes from QB **Derrick Ponder** (26-46-0, 279 yards), his second and third of the game, the last coming with 1:11 to play. KSU recovered the ensuing sideside kick and was able to run out the clock.

KSU's only loss is a close 13-7 decision to **Tuskegee**

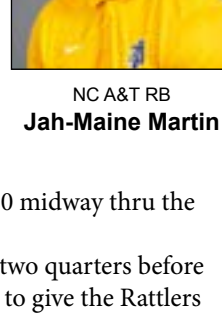

• **NO DOUBT!!** - Running back **Jah-Maine Martin** ran for 108 yards and four touchdowns Thursday as BCSP No. 1 **NORTH CAROLINA A&T** shut out **Delaware State**, 37-0.

Martin scored on a 24-yard run to open the scoring in the first quarter, added 28- and 1-yard scoring runs before halftime and capped it his night off with a 33-yarder in the third quarter in the rout. He earned his total on just 14 carries and is now averaging 7.8 yards per carry and a league-best 135.8 rushing yards per game.

QB **Kytil Carter** (16-27-0, 167 yards) threw for the Aggies (3-1, 1-0 MEAC) other score when he hit **Kory Banks** on a 9-yard slant in the second quarter. A&T added a safety in the third quarter when DSU QB **Tylik Bethea** recovered a fumble in his own end zone. DSU is 1-3, 0-2 in the MEAC.

• **Norfolk State** battled BCSP No. 6 **FLORIDA A&M** all game and led 21-20 midway thru the third quarter but came up on the short end of a 30-28 score.

The nip-and-tuck battle saw the teams exchange touchdowns thru the first two quarters before FAMU placekicker **Yahia Ali** kicked a 30-yard field goal :14 seconds before halftime to give the Rattlers (3-1, 1-0 MEAC) a 17-14 lead at the break.

Ali added a 52-yarder to open the second half scoring but NSU RB **Kevin Johnson** went 36 yards for a score, his second of the game, to put the Spartans (1-4, 0-1) up 21-20 at the 7:16 mark of the third quarter. Ali was good again, this time from 37 yards with 1:33 left in the third to put FAMU back up 23-21.

It stayed that way until FAMU's **Cortez Reid** picked off NSU QB **Juwan Carter** (28-42-1, 308 yards) with just over 7:45 to play. The Rattlers scored six plays later on a 6-yard pass by **Terrell Jennings**, his second 6-yarder of the day, to lead 30-21 at the 4:36 mark.

Carter drove the Spartans 76 yards in 10 plays and cashed in on a 26-yard pass to **Anthony Williams** to pull them within 30-28 with 1:08 left. FAMU recovered the ensuing sideside kicks and ran out the clock.

FAMU QB **Ryan Stanley** (27-37-0) threw for 293 yards and a score, a 40-yarder to **David Manigo** for FAMU's touchdown. WR **Xavier Smith** hauled in nine aerials for 98 yards. Running back **Bishop Bonnett** was the workhorse on the ground carrying 20 times for 109 yards.

• BCSP No. 10 **SOUTHERN** put a stop to the momentum and the hype concerning BCSP No. 7 **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** as the Jags put a 31-7 whipping on the Golden Tigers on their home field in Pine Bluff.

Southern QB **Ladarius Skelton**, a Pine Bluff native, rushed for three touchdowns and the Jags racked up 269 rushing yards and scored four times on the ground in subduing UAPP (3-1, 0-1 SWAC W).

Christopher Chaney led the ground attack with 107 yards on 12 carries. **Devon Benn** added 94 yards on 26 totes. But Skelton (8 carries, 47 yards - 17-25-2, 157 yds.) delivered the payoffs. **Jarod Sims** scored the other Southern TD on a 3-yard first quarter run.

UAPP QBs **Shannon Patrick** (16-26-3, 159 yards) and **Skyler Perry** (9-14-1, 116 yards) were able to move the ball but were picked off four times.

• Senior QB **Akevious Williams** (16-23-0) passed for 199 yards and ran 101 yards and three scores as BCSP No. 4 **BETHUNE-COOKMAN** beat **Howard** 37-29 despite an outstanding outing from first-time starting QB **Quinton Williams**.

B-CU's Williams ran for 13- and 2-yard scores on the Wildcats' (3-1, 1-0 MEAC) first two possessions to post an early 14-0 lead. Following a 75-yard run from RB **Dedric Parsons**, Howard got on the board as Williams, subbing for former Howard standout QB **Caylin Newton**, hit **Damion Gillespie** from 6 yards out.

B-CU RB/KR **Jimmie Robinson** returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards before he was tackled at the Howard 3. **James Washington** covered the final 2 yards to give B-CU a 21-7 lead late in the opening quarter. The Wildcats added a 27-yard **Xavier McDonald** field goal near the end of the second quarter to lead 24-7 at the break.

Quinton Williams (21-35-1, 179 yards) connected with **Vi Thomas** from 24 yards out early in the third quarter and then scored on a 12-yard run early in the fourth quarter to pull the Bison within 24-21. But Akevious Williams led the 'Cats on a 9-play, 72-yard drive capped by his 5-yard scoring run with 8:25 to play. **Trevor Merritt** picked off the Howard QB two plays after the kickoff leading to **Que'Shaun Byrd's** 8-yard scoring run to put the 'Cats up 37-21 with 5:28 left.

Williams would close out his day with a 20-yard scoring pass to **Damion Gillespie** with 3:26 left. B-CU recovered Howard's sideside kick and was able to run out the clock.

• BCSP No. 3 **ALCORN STATE** got six touchdown passes from QB **Felix Harper** (21-30-0, 396 yards) to pull away from **Mississippi Valley State** and post a 45-19 win.

Harper had a TD toss of 19 yards in the first quarter to **LeCharles Pringle** and a 69-yard hook up with **Chris Blair** and another of 26 yards before halftime. MVSU trailed only 21-13 at the break as QB **Dejerric Bryant** scored on a 1-yard run and hit **Jimmy Wilson** from 16 yards out just before the half.

Harper continued his sharpshooting in the second half, hitting Pringle (6 rec., 86 yds., 3 TDs) from 39 yards and 8 yards away and Blair (3 rec., 144 yds., 2 TDs) again from 32 yards.

• BCSP No. 8 **VIRGINIA UNION** blocked a punt with just inside two minutes left and cashed in on a 25-yard **Jefferson Souza** field goal, his third of the game with less than :20 seconds left, to pull out a 16-15 win over **Winston-Salem State**.

Souza connected in the third quarter from 25 yards out and had another 25-yarder early in the fourth quarter, VUU's only points of the second half after trailing 9-7 at the half.

WSSU had scored twice in the second quarter on a field goal by **P. Buenaventura** and a 5-yard pass from **Naill Ramadan** to **Chandler Belk**. But the Rams only led 9-0 after Buenaventura missed the PAT. VUU got its only touchdown when the Panthers put together a 11-play, 66-yard drive to score with :37 seconds left in the half on a 11-yard pass from QB **Khalid Morris** to **Jaiden Reavis**. Souza converted the PAT.

After Souza's first second-half field goal, WSSU scored early in the fourth quarter on **Farr Murchison's** 1-yard run to go up 15-10.

• CIAA member BCSP No. 10 **BOWIE STATE** and **LIVINGSTONE** remained the only undefeated teams in black college football with wins Saturday.

Bowie State (4-0, 1-0 CIAA N) QB **Ja'Rome Johnson** (19-29-1) threw for 307 yards and four TDs and ran for two scores as the Bulldogs manhandled **Saint Augustine's** 54-6. WR **David DuShon** had seven catches including TD grabs of 16 and 7 yards.

Livingstone (4-0, 1-0 CIAA S) QB **Miles Hayes** threw for one TD and passed for two others as the Blue Bears downed **Lincoln (Pa.)**, 35-19.

• **NOTICEABLY ABSENT!!** - **Howard** QB and **MEAC** Preseason Offensive Pressason Player of the Year **Caylin Newton** did not suit up for the Bison's home game Saturday vs. **Bethune-Cookman** and may not play again this season.

According to sources, Newton, a junior who won rookie of the year and offensive player of the year honors in the league in his first two seasons leading the Bison, reportedly missed the outing vs. B-CU to avoid burning a redshirt opportunity by playing in his fifth game. He played his first two seasons under former head coach **Mike London**.

He is set to graduate in May and will have two years of eligibility remaining and could play immediately at another program as a graduate.

The biggest question is why has Newton decided

to go this route. Through four games, Howard was 1-3 under new head coach **Ron Prince** with Newton at the controls of the offense. Prince had vowed in the preseason to cut down on Howard's turnovers and has perhaps curbed some of Newton's playmaking abilities.

Through the four games, Newton was second in the MEAC in passing yards (203.8 ypg) with six TDs and three interceptions while completing 51.2% of his passes. He had run 58 times for only 61 yards.

In two years in London's offense, Newton passed for 5,061 yards and 35 TDs and ran for 1,275 yards and another 16 scores.
